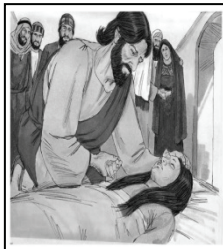

We are made for life, not for death, proclaims the book of Wisdom. We are made in God's image, which is destroyed only by spiritual death. The two miracles reported in today's gospel show how Jesus gives the fullness of life in response to faith. According to Jewish law, the women suffering from hemorrhage was considered unclean and prohibited from participation in public worship; anyone she touched would also be unclean. Despite her fright, she is discovered by Jesus, who ignores the taboos and commends her faith. Then he encourages Jairus. Having reached the house, Jesus is calm despite the mourners' commotion; for death is merely a sleep from which the Lord will wake us. When Jesus himself rose from the dead, the meaning of the raising of this girl would be understood. St. Paul speaks on quite another subject. He invites generosity toward the poverty-stricken church of Jerusalem. The Corinthians were asked to share their wealth equally. We too should be able to rely on one another for help – because we belong to the communion of saints!

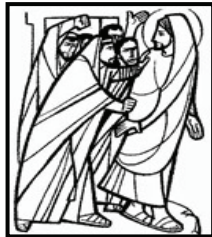

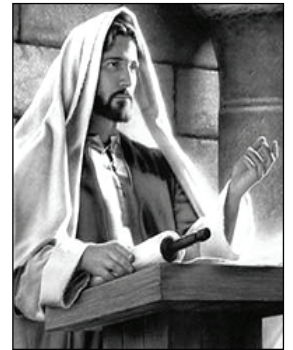

14th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - B

How different we would have reacted if Jesus had been our neighbor! Or would we too have questioned whether so familiar a person could be chosen by God for a special work? Would we have listened to a manual laborer who preached with wisdom and healed with power? The people of Nazareth called Jesus his mother's son, a designation



which was both unusual and insulting; in Mark's gospel, however, it alludes to the virgin birth. How necessary faith is: Mark startles us by the statement that Jesus could not work miracles in Nazareth. Jesus' lack of success runs throughout Mark's account, and his experience of rejection by the townspeople, and even by his own relatives, anticipates the passion. The first reading informs us that God sends prophets to speak against rebellious people. The apostle Paul had much experience of reversal and rejection. Gradually he learned to rejoice in his weakness, for it made him rely on God's strength. God was manifested in the humanity of Jesus, and God's power works most effectively when we accept our human weakness and depend on God's grace.
