Faith is a beam radiating from the face of God -St J.Eudes

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Faith rests on things that truly are.

Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice." Pilate said to him, "What is truth?" — Jn 18:37-38

The ancient Greeks had a simple definition of truth: "to say of what is, that it is; and of what in not, that it is not." It is a mark of the extent of the degradation of our culture that we can no longer speak plainly about reality, but rather we are coerced into pretending that black is white and up is down; a man is a woman, and killing is health care.

It is sad to see this kind of tragic nonsense prevalent in our secular culture, but it is much worse to see it making its way within the Church, which Scripture calls "the pillar and bulwark of the truth." If ever the Church loses her grip on the truth, we will be in desperate times. Amidst these troubles, we need to stay "rooted and built up in Christ and established in the faith."

This means, first of all, holding fast to the truth that has been passed down to us in Sacred Scripture. The Bible both the Old and New Testament — is inspired by the Holy Spirit. When Scripture is read in Church we proclaim that it is truly "the word of the Lord."

However, the rule of our faith is not 'Scripture alone' but 'Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition.' The Second Vatican Council stated that Sacred Tradition "transmits in its entirety the Word of God which has been entrusted to the Apostles by Christ the Lord and the Holy Spirit."

The secular culture, of whatever time or place, will always present a challenge to the Church. This challenge can only be met by holding to the truth. St. Irenaeus said, "Faith is produced by the truth; for faith rests on things that truly are." Truth does not change. What was true for St. Irenaeus in the 2nd century was true for St. Teresa of Avila in the 16th century, and continues to be true for us in the 21st century. This is simply the Catholic faith. It is one and the same, and true for all times. It does not need to be 'updated' or 'adapted.'

As the Benedictine Abbot Anscar Vonier once wrote:

Far from us any lowering of the Christian truth under the strange delusion that thus we might gain men to Christ. Is Christ in need of our falsehoods? Is the arm of Christ so shortened that He cannot carry out the counsels of His heart except through diminished verities? He does not ask us, as He did not ask His disciples, to give Him a temporal kingdom. He asks us to do what He himself did, "to bear witness to the truth." Those that are of the truth will hear our voice as they hear the voice of Christ.
