

The Cost of Discipleship

How often I failed in my duty to God because I was not leaningon the strong pillar of prayer. St. Teresa of Avila.

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

All things work together for good for those who love God.

I am writing this on August 22th, even though it will not appear in the bulletin until the 28th. On Saturday August 13th I experienced sudden hearing loss in one ear. I did not worry too much about it, but when I went to the walk-in clinic that Tuesday the doctor told me to go immediately to the hospital E.R. Since I am new to Toronto I decided to seek treatment in Ottawa since all my family is here. So I packed quickly on Tuesday afternoon, got through the E.R. at the Ottawa General Hospital and had my first appointment with the ear doctor on Wednesday afternoon. I have more follow-up appointments until the end of August, so I will be staying in Ottawa until then. I do not know if my hearing will return, but I am praying and hoping for the best. I will be back in the parish on the first of September.

Today, August 28th, is the feast day of my alltime favorite saint, St. Augustine of Hippo, (354-430 A.D.). You will notice that I frequently quote St. Augustine in my homilies and in my bulletin pieces. Here is a little something that I recently gleaned from one of St. Augustine's homilies on the necessity of prayer: "Do you imagine that God doesn't know what our needs

are? As he knows what we lack, he knows in advance what our desires are. He warned his disciples, 'Do not talk much in your prayer, for your Father knows what you need even before you ask him for it.' But he also says, 'Pray always and do not grow weary.'

"Well, in order to sort this one out, we must ask, seek, and knock. So, my friends, I am obliged to urge on both you and myself to prayer. In all the many evils of this present life the only hope we have is in knocking by prayer, and in being firmly convinced that your Father does not give us what he knows is not good for us. You know what you desire, but he knows what is good for you. Do not, however, hesitate to ask for what you need. Ask, don't think twice about it. But if you don't get it, don't feel bad about it. You are under the care of the creator and restorer of both your body and soul."

The only real evils in this life are what separate us from God. And as St. Paul says: "What can separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword. No, in all things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. Nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."
