FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Never tire of speaking out in defense of life.

Within our culture, the taking of innocent human life has now become normalized and is being promoted as a 'human right.' We have the scandal of a President of the United States claiming to be a 'devout Catholic' and promising to legalize abortion on demand through all nine months of pregnancy up to the moment of natural birth. This scandal is amplified by the refusal of the highest authorities in the Church to rebuke or to correct him. One need not comment on our Canadian politicians since they make no pretense of any religious faith.

As Christians we have a solemn duty to defend the right to life — both at the beginning and the end of life. We must do what we can to abolish both abortion and euthanasia. Nor should we be lulled into complacency by deceitful euphemisms such as 'reproductive rights' or 'medical assistance in dying.' As disciples of Christ, we need to *publicly* stand up for the dignity and value of all human life.

Pope John Paul II said: "Never tire of speaking out in defense of life." In his Encyclical *Evangelium Vitae* (The Gospel of Life), he wrote:

There has been a profound change in the way in which life and relationships between people are considered. Choices once unanimously considered criminal and rejected by the common moral sense are gradually becoming socially acceptable. The end result of this is tragic: not only is the fact of the destruction of so many human lives still to be born or in their final stage extremely grave and disturbing, but no less grave and disturbing is the fact that conscience itself, darkened as it were by such widespread conditioning, is finding it increasingly difficult to distinguish between good and evil in what concerns the basic value of human life.

As citizens, by opposing the culture of death we are promoting the good of society. As Pope John Paul II said:

The Gospel of Life is for the whole of human society. To be actively pro-life is to contribute to the renewal of society through the promotion of the common good. It is impossible to further the common good without acknowledging and defending the right to life, upon which all the other inalienable rights of individuals are founded and from which they develop. A society lacks solid foundations when, on the one hand, it asserts values such as the dignity of the person, justice and peace, but then, on the other hand, radically acts to the contrary by allowing or tolerating a variety of ways in which human life is devalued and violated, especially where it is weak or marginalized. Only respect for life can be the foundation and guarantee of the most precious and essential goods of society, such as democracy and peace.


