FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Decline and renewal.

The gist of liberalism is well conveyed by a fresco in the refectory of my abbey in Hungary. It shows streams of wine bursting forth from a barrel from which the hoops are falling off. Under the fresco stand the words: *libertate periit*, "through liberty, it is lost." — Fr. Stanley Jaki.

I recently came across a book on the history of the Discalced Carmelites. The author comments on the sudden decline in vocations that affected nearly all religious orders following the Second Vatican Council. He writes:

The "fresh air" which Pope John XXIII had wanted to let into the Church became a hurricane. The shock of so many changes coming at the same time caused a crisis of faith. Many people in religious life had been putting matters of practice and discipline on the same level as matters of faith and dogma. They therefore became confused and disheartened when they found these external aspects suddenly subject to change.

There is no doubt that the Church entered a period of rapid decline following the Council. Perhaps this was due to the general upheaval in Western culture in the late 1960's, and it would have occurred with or without the Council. Perhaps the apparent robustness of the Church in 1950's and early 60's was an empty facade. Perhaps the Council merely exposed the fact that for many practicing Catholics their religion was, as Thomas Merton noted at the time, "a matter of pure conformism and expediency."

As another author comments:

There is no greater proof of the weakness underlying much of traditional Catholic life than the amazingly quick collapse of the formerly imposing facade of Catholicism after the Council. The faith of countless numbers of the faithful proved unable to withstand the shock. Too many Catholics proved to be not very Catholic, as the confusion of the times led them to abandon the Church.

As I reflect on this, I picture a great medieval Cathedral. This soaring architectural wonder is made possible by the "flying" buttresses which support its relatively thin walls. Take away the buttresses and the Cathedral falls into a pile of rubble. I guess we could say: there is no greater proof of the weakness of the Cathedral than its quick collapse when the buttresses have been removed.

Perhaps the "collapse" of the faith after the Council did not reveal an inherent "weakness." Rather, it revealed that faith needs strong support. The Church exists to provide this support, through the Sacraments, through her customs rituals and devotions. This is the traditional wisdom of the Church. Our faith needs support, just as a Cathedral needs buttresses, or as a wine cask need hoops.
