

#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The season of singing has come.

See! The winter is past; the rains are over and gone. Flowers appear on the earth; the season of singing has come, the cooing of doves is heard in our land. The fig tree forms its early fruit; blossoming vines spread their fragrance. — Song of Songs 2:11-13.

My installation as Pastor is taking place this Saturday. This will be only my second time going through that ceremony. Hopefully, it will be my last. I arrived here on June 28th and I am slowly becoming acquainted with the parish. I hope to know more of you much better, but it takes time. I was in my last parish for eleven years, and I still did not know everyone. There are definite advantages of staying in one place, but priests are not given that option.

The above quote from *The Song of Songs* may seem inappropriate in the middle of a chilly October, but it expresses how I feel. The Church has just come through over two years of enforced inactivity. Like the land of Narnia under the rule of the White Witch, it has been a continual winter without any Christmas. The time has now come to exit from the cave in which we have been hiding and to breathe the free air again. Having been cooped up for so long, we have forgotten what freedom feels like.

No one is a Christian on his own. There is a reason that Christ established the Church. We are meant to be a spiritual family. Just as we are to know God, to love Him, and to serve Him (in this world, so that we may live with Him forever in the next), we are also called to know, to love, and to serve our neighbor — especially the members of our Church family. That is why it is so important that we have social events, where we can get to know each other and enjoy each other's company. Seeing each other at Mass is not enough. During the Mass our focus is on Jesus. We need other times to build community.

As a parish priest, I have always enjoyed visiting the schools. One of the hardest things for me during the lockdowns was not being able to see most of the school children for the last two years. Two years is long time in the life of a child. Thankfully, I have begun visiting our schools here and it is a great encouragement to see the children in the classrooms and out in the school yard without masks and behaving like normal kids. It is a joy to be able to see their faces!

Occasionally parishioners will complain about the number of announcements at Mass. It is, however, a sign of a healthy parish. I am hoping that we will have many parish activities to announce in the weeks to come. It is time to get back to normal parish life. We need to put the pandemic behind us and get over the lockdown mentality. This will be difficult for some people, but we cannot live forever in fear. The winter is past; the season of singing has come!



#### Are you able to host a Ukrainian family?



When hearing reports of the war in Ukraine, and the millions of Ukrainians that have been forced to flee their homeland, many have asked what they can do to help. Over 80,000 Ukrainians have

already arrived to Canada through a special visa program created by Immigration Canada. An additional 500,000 have applied to the program and are expected to arrive in the coming months. Many are arriving to Toronto and are without family here in Canada to help them. Among those will be some who are vulnerable to human trafficking, particularly seniors, single women, and women with children. There is an immediate need for families to host for a period of between one and six months some of those who have arrived.
