FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The resurrection of the body

If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit who dwells in you. — St. Paul to the Romans

St. Columba refers to the grave, not as the place of burial, but rather as the place of resurrection. In the Apostles' Creed we profess our belief in the "resurrection of the body." Somehow, even if the body in the grave is completely decomposed — even if the body is cremated and the ashes scattered to the four winds — this same body will be reconstituted and reunited with the soul.

The Catechism (362-366) states:

The human person, created in the image of God, is a being at once corporeal and spiritual. The unity of soul and body is so profound that one has to consider the soul to be the "form" of the body: i.e., it is because of its spiritual soul that the body made of matter becomes a living, human body; spirit and matter, in man, are not two natures united, but rather their union forms a single nature.

The Church teaches that every spiritual soul is created immediately by God — it is not "produced" by the parents — and also that it is immortal: it does not perish when it separates from the body at death, and it will be reunited with the body at the final Resurrection.

It is not correct to say that we have a body or that we have a soul. We are body and soul. Body and soul together make up the human person. A soul without a body is incomplete. In the resurrection, the integrity of our human nature is restored — not only restored, but glorified.

Fr. Charles Arminjon explains it this way:

Death means not ruin but restoration. If God has decreed that our earthly abode shall one day be dissolved, it is not for the purpose of despoiling us of it, but to render it subtle, immortal, and serene. His aim may be compared to that of an architect, says St. John Chrysostom, who has the inhabitant leave his house for a short period, in order to have him return with greater glory to that same house, now rebuilt in greater splendor.

I will leave the last word again to St. Paul, writing to the Corinthians:

But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" You foolish man! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body which is to be, but a bare kernel. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. The dead will be raised imperishable, for this perishable nature must put on the imperishable, and this mortal nature must put on immortality.

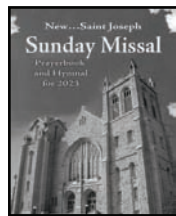

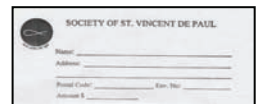
