FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Only the good has depth and can be radical.

Evil can overgrow and lay waste the whole world precisely because it spreads like a fungus on the surface. It is 'thought-defying' because thought tries to reach some depth, to go to the roots, but the moment that it concerns itself with evil, it is frustrated because there is nothing there. That is its 'banality.' Only the good has depth and can be radical. — Hannah Arendt

Evil exists. It is real. We see it all around us. And yet, it is also an impenetrable mystery. As the great Dominican theologian Reginad Garrigou-Lagrange says: The mysteries of grace (of love and goodness) are obscure to us because of their exceeding brightness — we are blinded by their light. But the mystery of evil is obscure not only *to us* but *in itself*, because it is by its very nature darkness — the privation of light, truth, and goodness.

In Tolkien's *The Lord of the Rings*, Galdalf explains the origin of the orcs: "The Shadow that bred them can only mock, it cannot make: not real things of its own. It did not give life to the orcs; it only ruined them and twisted them."

St. Augustine long ago said the same thing: "Evil, unless it is parasitic on something good, cannot exist at all. A man or an angel can exist and yet not be wicked, but there cannot be wickedness except *in* a man or *in* an angel. It is good to be a man or an angel; but it is evil to be wicked. If there is no good, then evil can have no mode in which to exist. Evil is a corruption of the good."

C. S. Lewis carries on this thought: "To be evil, Satan must exist and have intellect and free will, which are in themselves good. Even to be evil, the devil must borrow or steal from the good. Do you now see why Christianity has always said that Satan is a fallen *Angel*? It is a recognition that evil is a *parasite*, not the original thing."

In his homily at the start of the conclave that would elect him as Pope Benedict XVI, Cardinal Ratzinger warned of a great evil that was already apparent: "We are building a *dictatorship of relativism* that does not recognize anything as definitive and whose ultimate goal consists solely of one's own ego and desires."

Since then this evil has become ever more widespread. Abortion and euthanasia are now not only tolerated, but hailed as moral progress — using the deceitful euphemisms of 'reproductive health' and 'medical assistance in dying.' The innocence of our children is violated by the proponents of 'queer theory' and 'gender theory.' Racial hatred is stoked by 'critical race theory.' And those who raise moral objections to this 'progress' are labelled 'haters.'

Tolkien called evil 'the Shadow': it produces no light; it can only obscure the light. St. John tells us: "The true light which enlightens everyone was coming into the world" but "people loved darkness rather than light."
