FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The primacy of grace.

Naturalism is the denial of the possibility of an elevation of human nature into the supernatural order: rationalism is the application of this denial to human reason; liberalism is its application to human freedom; humanitarianism its application to human love; sensualism its application to sensibility; and socialism its application to society. — Fr. Garrigou-Lagrange

The root of the current problems which beset the Church is exactly this: the denial of the supernatural. Two perfect examples are the 'Synodal Way' now going on in Germany, and the preparations for the 'Synod on Synodality,' which will be held in Rome next year. Rather than re-proposing 'the high standard of ordinary Christian living', these synods are instead seeking ways to lower those standards, even to the acceptance of lifestyles which are categorically condemned by Holy Scripture.

Those in positions of spiritual leadership in the Church are now enthusiastically embracing rationalism, liberalism, humanitarianism, sensualism, and socialism. What will they gain from conforming to the world, rather than being conformed to Christ? They have forgotten the grandeur of man's true vocation: the supernatural life of grace.

Pope John Paul II emphasizes this crucial point in his landmark encyclical, *Novo Millennio Ineunte*:

In the planning that awaits us we must observe an essential principle of the Christian life: *the primacy of grace*. When this principle is not respected, is it any wonder that pastoral plans come to nothing and leave us with a disheartening sense of frustration? We then share the experience of the disciples in the Gospel story of the miraculous catch of fish: "We have toiled all night and caught nothing" (Lk 5:5).

The stated goal of some of those directing the 'Synod on Synodality' is the overturning of Catholic doctrine. One can only pray that they fail in their attempt.

Cardinal Sarah, after the fire that severely damaged Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, offered this reflection:

As I contemplate this ruined church, I cannot help but see in it a symbol of the situation of Western civilization and of the Church in Europe. Today the Church seems to be engulfed in flames on all sides. We see her ravaged by a conflagration much more destructive than the one that damaged the Cathedral of Notre-Dame.

This blaze, this conflagration, is a case of intellectual, doctrinal, and moral confusion. It is our cowardly refusal to proclaim the truth about God and man, and to defend and transmit the moral and ethical values of the Christian tradition. It is our loss of faith and the spirit of faith, a losing sight of the objectivity of faith and thus loss of the knowledge of God.
