### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

### Solemnity of St. Joseph

We do not fully comprehend the awesome sanctity of St. Joseph, whom God not only chose, but also prepared, to be the guardian of the Messiah. St. Joseph is often pictured as an elderly man. It has even been suggested that the 'brothers and sisters of Jesus' mentioned in the Gospels were the children of Joseph from a previous marriage. This has no support in Scripture. The early Church fathers, including St. Jerome, pictured Joseph as virile and chaste. He would have been the model of fatherhood.

St. Joseph is the patron of a happy death because he died in the arms of Mary and Jesus. But why did he die at all? With a mere word Jesus could healed him, as he healed so many others. Instead, Jesus permitted Joseph's death. Why?

In reflecting on this, I recall St. Augustine's account of a conversation he had with his mother, Monica:

My mother and I were leaning from a window that overlooked the garden. Our conversation was serene and joyful. We were wondering what eternal life would be like. As we spoke of the eternal Wisdom, and the life of the saints, we longed for it with all the strength of our hearts. For one fleeting instant we reached out and touched it. And then my mother said, "My son, why am I still in the world? There was one reason, and one alone, why I wished to remain a little longer in this life, and that was to see you a Catholic Christian before I died. God has granted my wish and more besides. What is left in the world for me to do?" It was about five days after this that she took to bed with a fever.

I can imagine a similar scenario with St. Joseph. Seeing Jesus grown to maturity, no longer in need of a protector and guardian, Joseph must have looked lovingly at Mary and her son, and thought, "What more do I have to do in this world? My mission is now accomplished." Joseph knew that Jesus' path led to the cross. He also knew that Jesus had to walk that path alone.

Every life must come to an end. But an 'end' does not always mean an abrupt cessation; it can also be a fulfillment and completion. When the weaver has completed his work he is satisfied, and he removes it from the loom. Joseph's life, in this sense, was satisfactorily completed. It was time for him to go. He welcomed death with peace of soul. If he felt some sorrow being separated from Mary, he knew that this would be only for a short time, and she would be well cared for in his absence.

Jesus did not cause Joseph's death, but he permitted it, just as he permitted the deaths of St. John the Baptist, St. Stephen, and all the martyrs, and just as he will permit my death and yours. Not so that we should be deprived of this earthly life, but so that we may, without any further delay, cross over into the fullness of the life of the saints.
