FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Weltanschauung und Zeitgeist

Today the Church proposes a new evangelization because there is more need of it, even more than there was fifty years ago, at the time of the Second Vatican Council. Recent decades have seen the advance of a spiritual 'desertification.' In the Council's time it was already possible from a few tragic pages of history to know what a life or a world without God looked like, but now we see it every day around us. This void has spread. — Pope Benedict XVI

Bishop Robert Barron often refers to the 'nones' those with no religious affiliation. Most of these 'nones' would refer to themselves as 'atheist' or 'agnostic.' They currently make up the majority of the populations in what were once Christian nations. It is to these people that the 'new evangelization' is directed.

It is not right to say that these 'nones' have no religion. Everybody has a religion in the sense that one's 'religion' is one's philosophy of life, or to use the German word, one's *Weltanschauung* (world-view). My world-view is formed by my Catholic faith. An Evangelical would claim to have a biblical world-view. The 'nones' may not be able to put a label on their world-view but they do have a system of beliefs, which they hold on to tenaciously, even if it consists of an assortment of disconnected and contradictory ideas.

Cicero, the great Roman orator, noted that "there is no idea so absurd that some philosopher has not said it." Absurdities have now become widely accepted 'truths.' For example, it is now firmly believed by many that a man can get pregnant. This is a matter of absolute faith, completely impenetrable to logic. Abraham Lincoln once asked: "How many legs does a dog have, if you call the tail a leg?" The answer: "Four. Calling a tail a leg doesn't make it a leg."

Our *Weltanschauung* (personal world-view) conforms, by default, to the *Zeitgeist*, the 'spirit of the times.' We are social beings. We have a deeply ingrained instinct to follow the herd. When everyone is tattooed, we feel a primal urge to join the crowd. In an overtly Christian country it is a matter of middle-class respectability to be seen in Church on Sunday. In an overtly post-Christian country, it becomes a matter of embarrassment.

Chesterton observed: When men cease to believe in God, they don't believe in nothing; they believe in anything. That 'anything' now consists of a dizzying array of 'critical' theories. Pope Benedict spoke of a spiritual desert. I do not see a desert. I see a garden overgrown and choked with weeds. We are in an age of 'irreligion' only in so far as belief in God is concerned. Faith abounds. But it is not faith in God. It is faith in the ability to make one's own 'truth.' We have eaten of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, and we have become like God.
