FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Christos anesti! Christ is risen!

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas (Peter), then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. — St. Paul

The Passover Plot was a 'sensational' bestseller when I was a teen. The author contends that the sponge soaked in sour wine that was offered to Jesus on the cross contained a drug that induced unconsciousness, mimicking death. This is a variation on the 'swoon theory': Jesus fainted on the cross and then revived in the coolness of the tomb. Some modern 'biblical scholars' take a simpler approach: they say that the disciples, distressed by their beloved teacher's death, simply fabricated the story of the resurrection.

These modern theories about the origins of Christianity pretend to be 'objective' by excluding the possibility of anything supernatural. In that case, Jesus can be no more than a gifted orator, and the conversion of the whole Roman Empire must be attributed to purely sociological factors. The message of the Gospel, they say, attracted many who were trapped in a slave economy, giving them dignity and hope. As for the miracles — turning water into wine, multiplying the loaves, curing Bartimaeus' blindness, bringing Jairus' daughter back to life — modern man, living in the 'Age of Science,' cannot believe any of that.

However, according to 'Occam's razor', the simplest explanation is usually the right one. If we admit the possibility that Jesus really is who he says he is, then everything else falls into place. Not only is the origin of Christianity explained, but also its phenomenal growth during an era of persecution, and its continual vitality through the centuries, as witnessed by innumerable Saints who have shown in their lives the power of the Holy Spirit.

St. John says: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God; all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made." The same divine power that created the entirety of the universe from nothing had no trouble turning water into wine or giving life to a dead body.

What ought to amaze us is that God, the second person of the Trinity, in an act of pure love, took on our human nature. He willingly suffered and died for us, and then he rose from the dead, 'breaking the bonds of death', so that we might have the gift of eternal life with him in heaven.

Christos anesti! Christ is risen.

Alithos anesti! He is truly risen.
