FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Adoro te devote, latens Deitas.

We firmly and unhesitatingly believe that the whole substance of the bread and wine is converted into the substance of the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus is present in the Eucharist in a true, real, substantial manner, with his Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. He is there, alive and glorious, wholly and entirely, God and man. St. Cyril says: "Do not doubt whether this is true, but rather receive the words of the Savior in faith, for since he is the truth, he cannot lie." — Cardinal Robert Sarah, *The Catechism of the Spiritual Life*

The neo-atheists think that they are being clever when they quote Mark Twain: "Faith is believin' what you know ain't so." It is a cynical twist on the teaching of the letter to the Hebrews: "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Faith indeed takes us beyond the mere appearances to the reality. As St. Thomas says, in his beautiful hymn, *Adoro te devote*: I adore you devoutly, Divinity here concealed.

Jesus' clear teaching on the Eucharist is presented in the sixth chapter the Gospel of St. John. Great crowds had followed Jesus into the wilderness. Having only five barley loaves and two fish, "Jesus takes the loaves, and having given thanks, he distributes them." Everyone eats until they are satisfied, and the leftovers fill twelve baskets.

Jesus then crosses to the other side of the Sea of Galilee. The crowds find him there. Jesus says to them: "Amen, amen, I say to you: you are seeking me not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you."

Jesus then instructs them: "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man, and drink his blood, you have no life in you. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." The crowds are scandalized. "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Many of his disciples "turned back and no longer went with him." Jesus then asked the twelve: "Do you also wish to go away?" Peter answers: "To whom shall we go? You are the Holy One of God."

We believe in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist because it is the explicit teaching of Jesus and the constant faith of the Church. As St. Ambrose says:

Do not the words of Christ have power to change the natures of elements? In the creation of the whole world 'he spoke and they came to be; he commanded and they were created.' If Christ could by speaking create out of nothing what did not yet exist, can we say that his words are unable to change existing things into something they previously were not? It is no lesser feat to create new natures for things than to change their existing natures.
