FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Mother's Day.

Yesterday, our new Archbishop, Francis Leo, ordained seven men to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Toronto, anointing their hands with the Sacred Chrism. The cloth that was used to wipe off the excess oil from their hands will be carefully preserved. When the mother of a priest dies that cloth is buried with her as a tribute to the sacrifice she made in offering her son to the Church. It is fitting that the ordinations occurred on the day before Mother's Day.

My own mother is now ninety-two years old and still living at home in Ottawa. It became clear last year that she could no longer be left on her own. She needed someone to be with her full-time. I took a leave of absence from my ministry in Alliston last November to stay with her until my new appointment here. My family has now hired care-givers to look after her. Of course I feel guilty for abandoning her, but she understands that a priest's life is dedicated to God. That is the sacrifice that she is making, and I have to trust that God will compensate her for my absence.

On this day we honor all mothers for the great sacrifices that they make for their families. Every mother shares in the motherhood of Mary, who is the model of motherhood. Mary's 'fiat' — 'let it be done to me according to your will' — was not given just once, but continually. It was most painfully given when she stood at the foot of the cross. Simeon prophesied to her that 'a sword will pierce your own heart too.' Every mother knows that pain.

May is the month of Mary, who holds preeminently the title of "mother" — *mater dei*, mother of God, Mother of Jesus, and mother of all Christians.

In the Gospels there is mention of the 'brothers and sisters' of Jesus. Since Mary remained a virgin for her whole life, it is assumed that these were actually cousins, since 'brother' was any close relation. My own thought and this is simply my own fancy — is that every child who met Mary would have been irresistibly attracted to her, and her motherly heart would have gone out to them. Should we be surprised if Mary had a large number of 'adopted' children? When Jesus spoke to the beloved disciple from the cross, saying "behold your mother", he was also speaking to us. "And from that day he took her for his own." All of us are also Mary's 'adopted' children. Priests especially, being configured to Christ in the Sacrament of Holy Orders, have a great devotion to Mary.

Christianity is a patriarchal religion: we have priests, not priestesses; God is Father, not Mother; the father has the responsibility of spiritual leadership of the family. But if father is the head, then the mother is the heart. When St. Therese of Lisieux found her vocation in being love in the heart of the Church, she was only taking on Mary's maternal role in the divine plan.



created by Immigration Canada. An additional 800,000 have applied to the program and are expected to arrive in the coming months. Many are arriving to Toronto and are without family here in Canada to help them. Among those will be some who are vulnerable to human trafficking, particularly seniors, single women, and women with children. There is an immediate need for families to host for a period of between one and six months some of those who have arrived.
