FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

To love this world is to break faith with God. Mark Twain described his mother as a genuinely good person who had no doubt about the legitimacy of slavery. Living before the American Civil War in the South, she had never heard any sermon opposing slavery, but only countless sermons preaching that slavery was God's will. With or without religion, good people can behave well and bad people can do evil; but for good people to do evil, that takes religion. — Steven Weinberg (Nobel prize physicist/atheist)

What if, in this opening quote, we replace the word 'slavery' with 'abortion'? Is Joe Biden a good person? He has declared many times, vociferously, that abortion is a human right; not only 'legitimate', but something to be championed as a positive good. Has Biden's religion somehow brainwashed him into believing that killing an innocent child in the womb is a good thing? Biden boasts of being a 'devout' Catholic, but the Catechism of the Catholic Church states with utter clarity:

Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person — among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life. ... Life must be protected with the utmost care from the moment of conception: abortion and infanticide are *abominable crimes*.

No doubt, Joe Biden thinks of himself as a good person. Maybe he has found a way to square his support for abortion with his claim to be Catholic. In the recent past, 'Catholic' politicians would dodge the issue by saying that they were 'personally opposed' but they would not impose their 'personal religious beliefs' on society. Biden does not even bother with that flimsy excuse. He has unequivocally declared: "I believe that a woman's 'right to choose' (i.e., abortion) is fundamental."

I am only picking on Biden because he is currently the most prominent 'Catholic' politician. Biden shamelessly visits the Pope for photo-ops and then boasts that the Pope gives him Communion, implying that the Pope approves of his actions and that he is a Catholic in good standing.

If it takes 'religion' for good people to do evil, how do we explain 'good people' like Biden endorsing what their religion categorically condemns as an 'abominable crime'? The simple explanation is that they look to their culture rather than their religion for guidance in moral decision making. If it is politically expedient, they do not hesitate to act contrary to basic Christian morality. This is nothing new. Long ago, St. Augustine observed: "To love this world is to break faith with God, yet men are applauded for it and are ashamed to be otherwise."
