FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

To confess the name of Christ boldly.

The Sacrament of Confirmation gives the baptized a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross. — Catechism of the Catholic Church.

This Sunday we are conferring the Sacrament of Confirmation. Every Sacrament is 'an *outward sign* of *inward grace*.' In the case of Confirmation the 'outward sign' is the anointing on the forehead with the Sacred Chrism, along with the words, "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." The 'inner grace' is the assistance of the Holy Spirit to live and proclaim the Gospel.

In the Rite of Confirmation we ask God to send his Holy Spirit on the Confirmandi (those to be Confirmed), and to "give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and fortitude, the spirit of knowledge and piety; fill them with the spirit of the fear of the Lord."

These seven 'gifts of the Holy Spirit' — wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord — are defined as 'permanent dispositions which make man docile in following the promptings of the Holy Spirit.' They are like sails on a boat catching the wind; the 'gifts' make us responsive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. To live holy lives we need to expand and spread our spiritual sails and allow the Holy Spirit to empower us.

Although the gifts of the Holy Spirit are received in the Sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation endows those gifts with a new 'mode' particularly suited to the challenges that the confirmed will be facing at their stage of the life. They are making a solemn commitment to live as disciples of Christ and to proclaim the Gospel. That is a huge promise, a promise that is not easy to keep, especially in view of the many challenges that they will encounter in our current culture. In the Sacrament of Confirmation God promises all the graces that they will need to surmount those challenges.

The Sacrament of Confirmation can be understood as an 'upgrade' to the graces that are received in Baptism. When you upgrade your cellphone you acquire wonderful new features. However, if the battery runs down that phone will not work. Similarly, if your spiritual battery is dead the spiritual upgrade of Confirmation also does not work.

Jesus, in referring to the graces of the Holy Spirit, says: "The water that I will give will become in you a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." We must keep the channels of grace open at our end. We do this by daily prayer, regular Confession and the Eucharist *at least* every Sunday. St. Irenaeus says: "Just as the soul give life to the body, so the Holy Spirit gifts life to the soul — we are only truly alive when we are alive in the Holy Spirit."
