FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Cor Jesu Sacratissimum — The Sacred Heart of Jesus Devotion to the Sacred Heart calls forth from our hearts a loving personal response to Jesus and to the pathway to holiness that he reveals in the Gospel. It is a pathway that begins with his initial message: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." The love of Christ which we celebrate is always found in the context of the truth of God's will, and the bracing call to holiness. — Cardinal Thomas Collins

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, with the Feast of the Sacred Heart being celebrated on Friday, June 16th. The heart is considered the center of our emotions. By becoming incarnate, the Second Person of the Trinity took on the fullness of human nature, including the full range of human emotions. As God, Jesus loves each of us individually with an infinite and eternal love, an act of his divine intellect and will. As man, Jesus' heart feels that love, both as a deep yearning for us to be one with him, but also as a deep sorrow when he sees us rejecting him.

This month of June presents us with a choice: we can follow the 'spirit of the age', the *Zeitgeist*, or be guided by the Holy Spirit. St. Paul exhorts us: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God — what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Throughout the Old Testament, we see the people succumbing to the temptation to abandon the God of Israel in favor of 'other gods.' When Joshua was preparing to lead his people into the Promised Land he said to them:

If serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve... But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord.

As Christians living in a post-Christian culture, we are daily faced with that same choice. It is instinctive to our human nature as social beings to feel the urge to conform to the culture of the society in which we live, even when that culture is opposed to God.

Back in the early 1960's, Thomas Merton lamented that religion had become "a matter of pure conformism and expediency, offering an apparent justification for lives that are essentially the same as those of our neighbors whose horizons are purely those of the world and of its transitory values."

During this month of June, we again are presented with that stark choice: Whom we will serve? Pope John Paul II, at the beginning of the millennium, warned of the danger of 'succumbing to the allure of substitutes and accepting alternative religious proposals.' That danger has only become greater with the passing years. This month we once again dedicate ourselves to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and accept "the bracing call to holiness."
