FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Wisdom is the application of right reason to action.

Wisdom is radiant and unfading, and she is easily discerned by those who love her, and is found by those who seek her. She hastens to make herself known to those who desire her. He who rises early to seek her will have no difficulty, for he will find her sitting at his gates. — The Book of Wisdom

The history of mankind is the story of progress in human knowledge. As each generation builds on the work of the previous one, there is an increasingly rapid development in all areas of science and technology.

The 18th century economist, Adam Smith, extolled the power of what he called 'the division of labor.' Among any group of people working together, as each person becomes more skilled in a specific task, the productivity of the whole group greatly increases. In any society there will be a myriad of specialists, each contributing to the good of all. How is it, then, that when it comes to wisdom there seems to be no progress, and even evidence of decline?

Plato answers this question by recounting a story of how the gods distributed to men the various human arts. With regard to wisdom the gods debated whether it should be given to a select few or to everyone? Zeus settled the matter: "If one person practices the art of medicine that suffices for many ordinary people, and so also with all the other arts, but as for wisdom, if all do not have a share of it mankind will never prosper."

For society to properly function all within it must have a share of wisdom. Wisdom is not simply knowledge; it is the application of knowledge to the actual situations of life. Wisdom must draw on a vast range of knowledge and experience. It must also be rightly ordered to the good. St. Thomas Aquinas says: "It belongs to wisdom to apply right reason to action, and this is not done without a right appetite. Hence wisdom is counted among the moral virtues."

It is not easy to acquire wisdom, even though Scripture assures us that those who search for wisdom will find her. The pursuit of wisdom is a never-ending quest. Year by year we strive to understand more fully the truth of our human condition. For help we turn to the truly wise men and women of the past (and present) for instruction and guidance. Even if we cannot claim for ourselves any great measure of wisdom we ought at least to be able to recognize lack of judgment and plain evil when we see it.

Too much of what counts as wisdom in this world is merely the rationalization of misbehavior. Many are wise for evil, few for good. St. Paul writes to the Corinthians: "If any one among you thinks that he is wise in this age, let him become a fool that he may become wise. For the wisdom of the world is folly with God."
