#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Discalced Carmelite Secular Order

It is considered good to walk in the vanities and pleasures of the world. But if any begin to give themselves to God, there are so many to criticize them that they need to seek companionship. Otherwise they will find themselves in much difficulty. — St. Teresa of Avila

On Saturday, September 9th, we celebrated the 14th anniversary of the establishment in this parish of the Lucia Dos Santos Community of the Discalced Carmelite Secular Order. Lucia Dos Santos, better known simply as Sister Lucia, was one of the three children to whom our Blessed Mother appeared at Fatima. Sister Lucia lived most of her life, until her death in 2005, as a Discalced Carmelite nun.

The 'discalced' Carmelites were a reform movement started by St. Teresa of Avila in Spain in the 16th century. Like many other religious orders, the Carmelites developed a 'secular' branch, which offers spiritual formation for lay people. Carmelite spirituality centers on prayer, taking inspiration from the great Carmelite Saints, St. Teresa of Avila, John of the Cross, and Therese of Lisieux.

St. Teresa is celebrated as a great religious reformer. She was to a large extent responsible for a resurgence of the faith in her time. However, she did not set out to reform the Carmelite Order. Rather, her ambition was simply to live a more intense life of prayer within the Order. To accomplish this she set up a small convent where she and a small group of like-minded women could develop their relationship with God. It was never her intention to reform anyone else except herself. However, she set an example of holiness that other people saw, and admired, and followed.

There have been many other great Saints since Teresa's passing on 15 October 1582. It is safe to say that every one of them has learned from St. Teresa. Like all true prophets, St. Teresa points us towards Jesus, the Good Shepherd. In Jesus' day shepherds did not drive the sheep ahead of them; rather, they walked in front, and the sheep followed. St. Teresa is like the 'bell-whether', the lead ewe following the shepherd, with the other sheep coming up behind. St. Teresa does not have 'followers', rather she has an army of 'friends' who accompany her as she follows Jesus.

Today, there are many who say that the faith of St. Teresa is outdated, as if the Gospel has a 'best by' date. No. The Church is *semper reformanda*, always in need of reform. We need a new St. Teresa! Thankfully, we still have the original St. Teresa. Her words of teaching are still with us and they have lost none of their freshness and power. We still have a solid core of 'intentional disciples', such as those in the Discalced Carmelite Secular Order, who are intent on drawing closer to God in prayer and the Sacraments.
