

#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

#### Life in the Spirit

Just as the soul gives life to the body, so the Holy Spirit gives life to the soul. We are only truly alive when we are alive in the Holy Spirit. — St. Irenaeus

I know several people whose faith has been jolted back to life by the *Life in the Spirit* seminar. This experience of spiritual renewal has been called 'baptism in the Spirit' — a misleading term borrowed from the Protestant Charismatic movement. When we were baptized in the Catholic Church, usually as infants, we were baptized 'in water *and the Holy Spirit*.' No further 'baptism' is needed, nor is it possible.

In the Rite of Baptism, the baptized person is given a candle which has been lit from the Easter Candle, with the command to "keep this flame of faith alive in your heart!" Sadly, in most cases, that flame is soon allowed to go out. A baptized child may subsequently receive First Holy Communion and Confirmation without that flame ever being reignited.

We can think of the sacramental grace that is given to us in Baptism as being like receiving a new cell phone, one which connects us to God. The 'flame of faith' is the battery. If the battery is not kept charged then the phone becomes useless. In the Sacrament of Confirmation we get a major 'upgrade.' But again, if the battery is dead, that new improved phone is just a paperweight.

When our spiritual battery is dead the graces of the Sacraments — Baptism, Confirmation, Marriage — remain inactive. The experience of 'baptism in the Spirit' is the charging of our battery. In an instant all those sacramental graces come alive. Our soul is like a house which has been sealed up for years; when the windows are opened the sunlight and fresh air flood in.

In the Book of Revelation, Jesus says: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If any one hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me." The aim of the *Life in the Spirit* seminar is to hear Jesus knocking and to open the door and invite him in.

We all ought to desire a closer relationship with God. We should all earnestly yearn for the Holy Spirit to be more fully active in our souls. Yet we feel within ourselves 'a remarkable resistance.' We are afraid of what the Spirit may do if we truly allow him to be the life of our souls. We fear that the Holy Spirit may actually transform us.

In face of this fear, we need to remember, as St. Augustine says, that "God is more present to us, than we are to ourselves." This is the God who created our souls by a pure act of love. The Holy Spirit does not transform us into something other than ourselves; rather, in the Holy Spirit we become more truly who we are, who God created us to be. Here we need to recall the words of Pope John Paul II: "Do not be afraid! Open wide the doors to Christ!"
