#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Euphemism and an evolving society.

This is the great object to be aimed at in the present age: we need not dispute, we need not prove; we need to *define*. When men understand each other's *meaning*, they see, for the most part, that controversy is either superfluous or hopeless. — Cardinal Newman

As a general rule, if you need a euphemism for what you are doing, it is probably evil.

We are living in an age of rampant euphemisms. We do not say 'abortion'; we way 'reproductive choice' or, better still, 'reproductive health care.' We do not say 'euthanasia,' we say 'medical assistance in dying.' Other euphemisms simply defy rational thought: what reality is hiding behind the words 'gender affirming health care'?

What I find interesting is that the now forbidden words 'abortion' and 'euthanasia' were themselves, not so long age, euphemisms. To abort is to end something before its natural completion. For example, if a project that you are working on takes a wrong turn, you can simply abort it and start over. To 'abort' a child is simply, innocuously, to 'terminate a pregnancy.' And 'euthanasia' literally means 'good death.'

The problem with euphemisms is that they have a short shelf life. Over time the euphemism inevitably takes on the meaning of the reality it is meant to conceal, and a then new euphemism is needed. Perhaps we can discern a glimmer of hope in the fact that euphemisms are still necessary — that the reality they are obscuring is still felt to be distasteful.

Not so many years ago a Canadian Prime Minister felt compelled to make excuses:

Certainly, many of us in this House, myself included, have a strong faith, and we value that faith and its influence on the decisions we make. But we are responsible for serving all Canadians and protecting the rights of all Canadians. We will be influenced by our faith but we must not shrink from the need to reaffirm the rights and responsibilities of Canadians in an evolving society.

Such dissimulation, however, now seems quaint, like the fig leaves that were at one time applied to the nude figures in the Sistine Chapel. Politicians no longer use the trope that they are 'personally opposed to [fill in the blank] but ...' Pretended reluctance is now passé. Our 'evolving society' has evolved beyond such old-fashioned qualms.

Nietzsche wrote about the 'transvaluation of all values' — the inversion of good and evil. In the case of Nietzsche, this was a conscious choice to discard the vestiges of Christian morality in favor of the power of the will. What we see in our own times is an unconscious transformation. Christian morality is now disdained as a hindrance to true moral progress towards a better and brighter future.
