#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The splendor of truth

Man is constantly tempted to turn his gaze away from the living and true God in order to direct it towards idols, exchanging "the truth about God for a lie." Man's capacity to know the truth is also darkened, and his will to submit to it is weakened. Thus, giving himself over to relativism and scepticism, he goes off in search of an illusory freedom apart from truth itself. — *Veritatis Splendor*, Pope John Paul II

The moral *relativist* believes that every society has its own set of moral standards — its own ideas of right and wrong, of what is acceptable or unacceptable, of what is worthy of praise or shame — and that there is no universal objective standard by which those societies can be judged.

The moral *progressive*, on the other hand, believes that the current moral standards of our own society are universal and absolute. These standards are the result of a process of evolution towards an ever more enlightened morality. We may not yet have arrived at the pinnacle of morality but we are making rapid progress towards it. We therefore can and must condemn other societies for their immorality, and apologize for the unenlightened morality of our own society just decades ago. The moral progressive judges everyone and everything relative to their current standards, even though those standards have no objective foundation — they are merely 'self-evident.'

Adam Smith, the father of modern economics, in 1759 published a book on the 'Theory of Moral Sentiments." The key word here is 'sentiments', that is, feelings. Smith's fundamental insight is that, as social beings, we are powerfully influenced by the approval or disapproval of our social community. This influence is almost imperceptible, but it moves us powerfully and gently; it is like a strong river current that carries us along without our being aware of it. Smith is not describing how things ought to be, but how they actually are — not how we ought to make moral decisions, but rather how we actually make them.

Christians are moral *realists*. The moral realist believes that there is a moral order to the universe. There are absolute standards of good and evil which do not change from place to place, or over the course of time, but which are universally valid. As Pope John Paul stated in his landmark encyclical *Veritatis Splendor*:

Only God, the Supreme Good, constitutes the unshakable foundation and essential condition of morality. The Supreme Good and the moral good meet in truth: the truth of God, the Creator and Redeemer, and the truth of man, created and redeemed by him. Only upon this truth is it possible to construct a renewed society, so as to make way for the authentic freedom of the person.




