FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The synthesis of all heresies

The great redemptive religion which has always been known as Christianity is battling against a totally diverse type of religious belief, which is only the more destructive of the Christian faith because it makes use of traditional Christian terminology. This modern non-redemptive religion is called 'modernism.' — J. Gresham Machen (1923)

In 1907, Pope Pius X issued an encyclical, *Pascendi*, in which he condemned 'modernism' as 'the synthesis of all heresies.' By the 1960's, the theological establishment had dismissed *Pascendi* as an embarrassing over-reaction to a problem that did not exist.

I came across *Pascendi* by accident in the early '90's. I had gone to a Catholic bookstore to get a recent encyclical by Pope John Paul II and there, on the same rack, was *Pascendi*. Knowing that it was somehow scandalous, I bought it with a feeling of guilty curiosity. Reading it provided one of those 'aha' moments, when suddenly the obscure becomes clear.

At the time, I was making my way back into the Catholic Church from a long time in the wilderness. My problem and it was a serious problem — was that I was powerfully drawn to the Church of St. Augustine and St. Teresa of Avila, but seemingly that Church no longer existed, having morphed into something akin to 'mainline' Protestantism.

Then Pope John Paul II issued the 'Catechism of the Catholic Church.' This was his corrective to the chorus of voices proclaiming, "The Church no longer teaches *that.*" Pope John Paul II, with his Catechism, said, "Well, actually, the Church *does* still teach *that.*" It was a declaration that Catholicism still existed. The Catechism, by the way, cites Augustine (86 times!), St. Teresa, and all my great Saints.

So the question is: how did the Church get into a state of confusion about the basic tenets of the faith such that a new Catechism was required to bring it back on track? And that brings us back to *Pascendi* and modernism.

Modernism at its core is a denial of the supernatural. For the modernist, the Prophets and Apostles were 'divinely inspired' only in that they had a heightened religious sense. Since God is in himself unknowable, one can know only one's *experience of God*, which evolves over time. The religious experiences of St. Augustine of St. Teresa were valid for their times, but the understanding and expression of the faith in our own times will necessarily be different, adapted to our own 'lived experience'.

This is the root of the scandal and confusion within the Church at the present time. To be clear, I am not putting myself forward as any kind of authority. I simply trust Augustine and Teresa infinitely more than those proposing a 'renewed understanding' of our Catholic faith.


