

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Grace builds on nature

Three things have been said of me: in my youth, that I was beautiful; later, that I was clever; and now, that I am holy. For a short time I believed the first two and now I have repented of it, but I have never been so deluded as to dream of believing the third. — St. Teresa of Avila

In fact, Teresa of Avila was charming and intelligent; for this reason, people greatly enjoyed her company. She was also endowed with more than the usual portion of practical good sense. We say that 'grace builds on nature', and divine grace elevated Teresa's natural gifts to the extent that she became a great Saint, a great Reformer, and a great Doctor of the Church. As her translator and biographer, E. Allison Peers said of her: "There is no life more real than the interior life of the soul: there is no writer who has a firmer hold on reality than St. Teresa."

As another observer commented:

True saints are people of experience and action. They have a sense of organization, the gift of commanding, and a head for business. Their works endure. In their endeavours they demonstrate prudence, daring, and good sense. As a matter of fact, good sense seems to be their fundamental guality, coupled with the most unusual powers of perception.

On the basis of this description, I can see similarities between St. Teresa and Mother Angelica, the founder of The Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN), another great reformer. Mother Angelica brought the faith into millions of homes by her television and radio broadcasts. She knew the Bible and the Catechism, and she loved the Lord. In 1985, Pope John Paul II said that "EWTN is the key to restoring the Roman Catholic Church in America." This uneducated Poor Clare nun did more to revitalize the faith than any other single person in the last fifty years.

Certainly, St. Teresa and Mother Angelica were both 'daring.' St. Teresa dared to establish a small convent in which the Carmelite rule could be lived in its original simplicity, overcoming strong opposition from the religious authorities. Mother Angelica dared to launch a television channel despite having no financial resources. Her motto was: "Unless you are willing to do the ridiculous, God will not do the miraculous."

St. Teresa and Mother Angelica were not at all similar in personality but they were both 'real.' They never tried to put on a 'pious' demeanor. They never tried to be anything other than who they were. They both had a deep abiding faith and an intense personal relationship with Christ. The grace of God worked through their individual personalities. Holiness shone through St. Teresa's charm and intelligence, and through Mother Angelica's feisty humor.

Knight of Columbus started the Annual *SOCK DRIVE* and will continue during the weeks of Advent. Donated unused socks, scarfs and gloves will be distributed


