

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Holy boldness

Saints are God's 'dummies.' God has a special love for those who are willing to be fools for his love and who have the courage to plunge forward full steam ahead when it comes to serving him. Dummies are not stupid. They simply do not know that it cannot be done. They only know that they have to be tough, that they have to be humble, and that they have to trust absolutely in the Lord. If they do these things in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, then they are sure to please the Lord and bring forth blessings for the entire world. — Mother Angelica

For Mother Angelica, 'holy boldness' was an 'eleventh commandment.' But it was boldness in service to the Truth. As St. Augustine says, "It is not the suffering that makes the martyr, but the cause." For Mother Angelica, the cause was to make known the sublime beauty of our Catholic Faith. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." What an amazing realization! The eternal God became incarnate, taking on our human nature, in order to suffer and die for each of us. Not for *humanity*! But for *you*, personally; and for me. "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are." Each of us is a beloved child of God.

There are many in this world who are bold for evil, and we rightly call them villains. Only those who are bold for good are called heroes. Mother Angelica is one of our Catholic heroes because she was bold in her profession and proclamation of the fullness of the Catholic faith.

Again, I cannot help comparing Mother Angelica to that great Doctor of the Church, St. Teresa of Avila, another one of God's 'dummies.' St. Teresa also taught the importance of holy boldness:

When a good inspiration comes to you, do not hesitate because of fear. I know by experience that if I resolve to do a thing for God's sake alone, it is his will that my soul shall at first be afraid. But if one lives a life of detachment for God's sake alone, there is no reason to be afraid that things will turn out amiss, since he is all-powerful.

I make no claim to sharing in that holy boldness. My tendency is to follow the advice of St. Augustine that it is better to make slow progress along the right path than to make great strides in the wrong direction. As Mother Angelica has said:

If you want to do something for the Lord, take the first step. The grace comes with that first step, and you get the grace as you step. It is doing nothing when you are afraid that is the problem.


