FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Creed or Chaos?

Official Christianity, of late years, has been getting 'bad press.' We are constantly assured that the churches are empty because preachers insist too much upon doctrine — 'dull dogma', as people call it. The fact is the precise opposite. It is the neglect of dogma that makes for dullness. The Christian faith is the most exciting drama that ever staggered the imagination of man — and the dogma *is* the drama. — Dorothy Sayers (1938)

I came across this quote by English novelist Dorothy Sayers in a collection of essays entitled "Creed or Chaos?" Like fellow Anglican, C. S. Lewis, Sayer was reacting to the dumbing down of the Christian message to make it more acceptable to modern sensibilities.

The doctrinal 'chaos' that Sayers was describing was by no means a recent development. John Henry Newman was preaching against it a century earlier, first as an Anglican clergyman and later as a Catholic priest. When he was made a Cardinal by Pope Leo XIII, Newman said in his acceptance speech: "For thirty, forty, fifty years, I have resisted to the best of my powers the spirit of liberalism in religion." He defined 'liberalism' as the 'anti-dogmatic principle,' the belief that 'there is no positive truth in religion.' Newman wrote: "Dogma has always been the fundamental principle of my religion. I know no other religion. I cannot enter into the idea of any other sort of religion. Religion, as a mere sentiment, is to me a dream and a mockery."

It should come as no surprise that simple adherence to Christian doctrine is now being disdained as 'rigidity' or 'fundamentalism', in favor of 'openness to new ideas.' Into the dumpster are tossed the words of St. Paul: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind." And those of Pope John Paul II: "Culture is not the measure of the Gospel, but it is Jesus Christ who is the measure of every culture and every human action."

The great Dominican theologian, Fr. Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange addressed the matter with his usual clarity:

We must study dogma in itself and not in relation to contemporary needs. If these needs become the norm what will remain of revealed Truth? It is not by impoverishing the word of God that souls are saved.

Or, getting back to Dorothy Sayers:

Let us, in Heaven's name, free the Divine Drama from the accumulation of slipshod thinking and trashy sentiment that has been heaped upon it, and set it on an open stage to startle the world into some vigorous reaction. If men are offended by Christ, let them be offended. It is not the business of the Church to adapt Christ to men, but to adapt men to Christ.


