FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Virgin Birth of Christ.

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way: When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. — Matthew 1:18

Among a stack of old books in the rectory I found one titled "The Virgin Birth of Christ' by J. Gresham Machen, a distinguished Presbyterian Biblical scholar from the early 1900's. In the Introduction he states:

According to a universal belief of the historic Christian Church, Jesus of Nazareth was born without a human father, being conceived by the Holy Ghost and born of the virgin Mary. How is the belief of the Church in the virgin birth to be explained?

Out of curiosity and respect for Machen, I attempted to read this book, but a dissection of the theories of "Hillmann, Hilgenfeld, Spitta, Gunkel, and others" defeated me. The book is colossally boring but it is not Machen's fault. The same is true of much of St. Irenaeus' "Against the Heresies" which goes into mind-numbing detail regarding the various gnostic heresies of his day. Heresies, whether arising in the 2nd or the 20th century, are simply not interesting.

Machen, however, like Irenaeus, undertook this labor with the admirable motive of defending the fundamentals of Christian doctrine which were being called into question. For example, in 1922, the liberal Protestant preacher Harry Emerson Fosdick asked in a famous sermon, "Shall the Fundamentalists win?":

We may begin with the question of the virgin birth of our Lord. I know people who hold quite different points of view about a matter. One point of view is that it actually happened. But there are many people whose opinion about our Lord's coming is as follows: The first disciples adored Jesus and they were sure that he came specially from God, but they phrased it in terms of a biological miracle that our modern minds cannot use. So far from thinking that they have given up anything vital in the New Testament's attitude toward Jesus, these Christians remember that the two men who contributed most to the church's thought of the divine meaning of the Christ were Paul and John, who never even distantly allude to the virgin birth.

St. Paul does say of Jesus that "though he was in the form of God, he did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men." And St. John states: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Not a man 'specially from God' but 'the Word was God'! This is 'the New Testament attitude towards Jesus': not 'the divine meaning of the Christ' but 'Christ's divinity'!

trays at the back of the church, according to the family's last name. All registered parishioners are kindly asked to inform the office of any changes to their personal data.


