# FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

False prophets then and now.

I did not send the prophets, yet they ran; I did not speak to them, yet they prophesied. But if they had stood in my council, then they would have proclaimed my words to my people, and they would have turned them from their evil way, and from the evil of their doings. — Jeremiah 23:21-22

It is not my job to comment on the goings-on in the Vatican, much less to rant about them — there are many reliable sources of comment for those interested in keeping abreast of current events in the Church — but there is a point at which keeping silent implies assent.

At the time of this writing, Cardinal Tucho Fernandez has not yet been removed from his position as head of the *Dicastery of the Doctrine of the Faith*, despite his having published a salacious book which totally discredits the work of the Dicastery, and which greatly impedes the evangelical witness of the Church.

A Vatican official is not exempt from criticism simply because he was appointed by the Pope. Cardinal Becciu was promoted by the Pope and he has just been sentenced to five years in prison for financial corruption. Do we need to be reminded of Cardinal 'Uncle Ted' McCarrick who wielded immense influence in the Church despite being widely known as a sexual abuser? High office in the Church demands a correspondingly high standard of accountability.

There are, thankfully, many good and faithful Bishops and Cardinals. For example, Cardinal Zen, the retired Bishop of Hong Kong has been heroic in his concern for the Church in China. Cardinal Mueller, former head of the *Dicastery of the Doctrine of the Faith*, and Cardinal Burke, former head of the *Apostolic Signatura*, and Cardinal Sarah, former head of the *Dicastery for Divine Worship*, have each been outspoken defenders of the faith.

Cardinal Sarah co-authored a book with Pope Benedict XVI, *From the Depths of Our Hearts*, re-affirming the Church's perennial teaching on priestly celibacy. Yet we now have Archbishop Scicluna of Malta, the Adjunct Secretary of the *Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith*, saying: "This will sound heretical to some people. If it were up to me, I would revise the requirement that priests have to be celibate." Yes, of course it sounds heretical.

People are leaving the Church, one observer noted, "not because they do not believe what the Church teaches, but because the Church *itself* does not believe what the Church teaches." Pope John Paul II, in *Novo Millennio Ineunte*, stated: "Christ must be presented to all people *with confidence*!" St. Paul the Apostle proclaimed Jesus as 'the power of God and the wisdom of God.' How much better off we would be if those whose job it is to uphold the faith actually believed that!
