

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Getting ready for Lent.

I am impressed with a sad presentiment, as if the gift of truth when once lost was lost forever. And so the Christian world is gradually becoming barren and effete, as land which has been worked out and has become sand. — Cardinal Newman (1833)

In his homily for the start of the 'Year of Faith', Pope Benedict quoted Cardinal Newman's 'sad presentiment' and then went on to say:

Today the Church proposes a new evangelization because recent decades have seen the advance of a spiritual 'desertification.' At the time of the Second Vatican Council it was already possible from a few tragic pages of history to know what a life or a world without God looked like, but now we see it every day around us. This void has spread.

But it is in starting from the experience of this desert, from this void, that we can again discover the joy of believing, its vital importance for us. In the desert people of faith are needed who point out the way to the Promised Land and keep hope alive.

During the season of Lent, which will begin with our observance of Ash Wednesday on February 14th, we recall and, to some extent, share the experience of the forty years that the people of Israel spent in the desert before entering the Promised Land, and the forty days that Jesus fasted in the desert preparing for his public ministry.

According to the traditional calendar we are already in the pre-Lenten period of 'Septuagesima.' It is the time to plan our observance of Lent so that it may be spiritually fruitful. Every gardener knows that plants need periods of dryness so that their roots are encouraged penetrate deeper into the soil and benefit from later watering.

Lent has been called a 'joy-filled' season. I do not know about that, but it is certainly 'grace-filled.' Over the years I have come to more fully appreciate the season of Lent. Beginning in mid-winter — a frigid desert — it culminates with the coming of spring and a burgeoning of new life at Easter. This year, especially, with the recent passing of my mother, Lent will be have a special meaning for me, as we follow the footsteps of Christ along the Way of the Cross towards the glory of the Resurrection.

Pope Benedict concluded his homily with these words: May this Year of Faith [this Lent] make our relationship with Christ the Lord increasingly firm, since only in him is there the certitude for looking to the future and the guarantee of an authentic and lasting love. We believe with firm certitude that the Lord Jesus has conquered evil and death. With this sure confidence we entrust ourselves to him: he, present in our midst, overcomes the power of the evil one.


