FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Catholicism is not possible without a Catholic culture The continued existence of Catholicism depends on our awareness that the belief of Catholics is intelligible and intellectually coherent. But we also need to be aware that this belief has become an object of hatred in a culture that lives in ways that are contrary to the order of right living. Catholicism is of its very nature a critique of the culture. — Fr. James Schall (1994)

This coming Ash Wednesday, as we receive ashes on our foreheads with the words "Repent and believe the Gospel", our neighbors will be celebrating Valentine's Day, oblivious to the fact that *Saint* Valentine is a Christian martyr who laid down his life for the Catholic faith.

We are once again reminded that we are living in a post-Christian society which still carries echoes of Christian observance, but devoid of any religious significance. The Catholic historian, Christopher Dawson, observed:

Culture is the *form* of society. A society without culture is a formless society — a collection of individuals brought together by the needs of the moment — while the stronger the culture is, the more completely does it inform and transform the diverse human material of which it is composed. It is clear that a common way of life involves a common view of life, common standards of behavior and common standards of value, and consequently a culture is a community which owes its unity to common beliefs and common ways of thought.

We are usually unaware of how much we have absorbed the secular values of the culture in which we are immersed. It is tragic to see self-proclaimed 'Catholic' political leaders fully embracing what Pope John Paul II called the 'culture of death.' Anti-Christian attitudes have even infiltrated into the Church, with the flagrant promotion of sinful behavior contrary to the virtue of chastity. Indeed 'chastity' is now considered a quaintly old-fashioned notion.

This coming Ash Wednesday is an opportunity to assert our Catholic identity by consciously entering into the spirit of Lent with its call to self-reflection and repentance.

We recently celebrated the *Feast of the Presentation* on February 2nd with the blessing of candles. Most people, however, even Catholics, were observing 'Groundhog Day.' In the 1993 film of that name the self-centered character played by Bill Murray lives the same day over and over again, until finally he is redeemed by acts of selflessness. The film is an illustration of a rabbinic saying: "What is the use of tomorrow if you are not going to be better tomorrow than you are today?"

As we embark on this journey of Lent our aim is to make each tomorrow count. This grace-filled season presents immense opportunities for us to draw closer to Christ as we accompany him on the Way of the Cross.
