FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Hold to the things that eternally endure.

I am away from the parish this weekend to take care of personal matters in Ottawa. In September my mother went into the nursing home and her house was put up for sale. After many anxious months the house is now sold and I am in Ottawa getting the house ready for the new owners. The closing date in March 19th, the Solemnity of St Joseph!

My previous parish was St Paul the Apostle Church in Alliston. When I was appointed Pastor there in 2011 I was surprised and delighted. Six years earlier I had done my Seminary internship year there, assisting the Pastor and being involved in all the various parish ministries. I was ordained as a Deacon in that Church in 2007. Returning there as Pastor was like going home. I already had many close friends among the parishioners, and the children whom I had helped prepared for First Communion were now preparing for Confirmation. I could not have asked for a better parish assignment.

In 2021 my mother was living alone in her long-time home with my sister dropping in frequently, but she was having some health issues. I asked my sister if I should think about coming to Ottawa to stay with Mom, but she said, "No, we can manage." Then in November of that year she said, "How soon can you get here?"

That is how I came to leave Alliston after it being my home for ten years. I lived with my Mom for six months before coming to Our Lady of Fatima. That gave my family time to make arrangements for care-givers. Although it was hard to leave my home in Alliston, I now see those months with my Mom as a great blessing.

When I left Alliston, all my belongings (mostly books) were moved to my Mom's house in Ottawa. When I came to Our Lady of Fatima I only brought the bare necessities. Now, after being here a year and a half, I will finally be moving in. I will also be bringing some of my Mom's furniture to furnish the empty rooms in the rectory.

This is going to be a strange Lent for me, moving out of my mother's house. In the Preface of the Mass for Lent we pray: "For you have given your children a sacred time for the renewing and purifying of their hearts, that, freed from disordered affections, they may so deal with the things of this passing world as to hold rather to the things that eternally endure." Now, as I am packing up the things of this passing world my mind does turn to those of eternity.

C. S. Lewis observed, "The pain now is part of the happiness then. That's the deal." When I was visiting my Mom in the nursing home we would reminisce about the good times. I am reminded of them now as I sort through the old photos. These last two years, as my Mom's health declined, despite the suffering and hardship, were also good times — grace-filled times.


