

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Faith and doubt.

Faith is certain. It is more certain than all human knowledge because it is founded on the very word of God who cannot lie. To be sure, revealed truths can seem obscure to human reason and experience, but the certainty that the divine light gives is greater than that which the light of natural reason gives. — Catechism of the Catholic Church

In a recent interview Bishop Robert Barron noted that the American Bishops had voted in favor of recognizing Cardinal Newman (canonized in 2019) as a 'Doctor of the Church.' This is indeed good news. I have often spoken of my huge debt to Newman for my own theological and spiritual formation.

I first encountered Newman many years ago in the Oakville Public Library, when I was still working as a Civil Engineer. Amidst a short shelf of books on the topic of Christianity was a 'Treasury of Catholic Wisdom' which included two essays by Newman, one of which was titled 'Faith and Doubt.' Having been subject to more than one homily assuring me that faith and doubt always walk hand in hand, it was refreshing to hear Newman say that 'faith and doubt are simply incommensurate'; that is, faith positively excludes doubt, and doubt is the absence of faith.

Somehow, we have accepted the commonly held notion that 'no one has a monopoly on the truth,' or that 'all "truth" is provisional.' Even in Newman's day, to declare that 'faith is *certain*' was considered an outrageous claim.

Newman writes:

The world, knowing nothing of the blessings of the Catholic faith, feels irritation at hearing that doubts are incompatible with a Catholic's profession of faith. The world disbelieves our doctrines and cannot understand our own believing them. It considers them so strange that it is quite sure that we are haunted day and night with doubts, and tormented with the fear of yielding to them. That there can be peace, and joy, and knowledge, and freedom, and spiritual strength in the Church, is a thought far beyond the world's imagination.

If these are your thoughts, you are simply in error. Trust me, rather than the world, when I tell you, that it is no difficult thing for a Catholic to believe; and that unless he grievously mismanages himself, the difficult thing is for him to doubt. He has received a gift which makes faith easy. He does violence to his mind, not in exercising, but in withholding his faith.

Faith is not a sentiment; faith is a conviction. It is a conviction more certain than any other conviction. It is Truth, but it is more than Truth: it is the Light by means of which we are able to see the Truth.


MASS OF CHRISM
