FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

In this world you will have trouble.

But understand this, that in the last days distressing times will come. For men will be lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, holding form of religion, but denying the power of it. — 2 Tim 3:1-5

Are we living in the 'end times'? Given current state of the world and the Church, that is a serious question. The answer is "Yes, of course we are: we have been living in the end times for the last two thousand years." The medieval monks began labelling years 'B.C.' and 'A.D.' because they recognized the coming of the Messiah as the key turning point in history: the era of the Old Covenant was completed and the era of the New Covenant was begun. However, this was not the beginning of an era of peace. In 66 A.D. the Jewish people revolted against Rome, resulting in the total destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple. Christians, meanwhile, were being martyred throughout the Roman Empire. It was in these circumstances that St. John received the visions of the epic battle between good and evil that he recorded in the Book of Revelation. The coming of the Messiah did not mark the end of history but only the beginning of the end times.

St. Augustine wrote his great work, *The City of God*, in response to the sacking of Rome by the Goths in 416 A.D.; for many Romans this meant the defeat of civilization by the barbarians. Two decades later Augustine died during the siege of his city of Hippo in North Africa. In the 7th century the armies of Islam conquered all of North Africa and Spain, and crossed the Pyrenees into France. For the people living, and suffering, through those times, it certainly seemed to be the 'end times.' As Cardinal Newman noted:

The whole course of Christianity from first to last is but one series of troubles and disorders. Every century is like every other; and to those who live in it seems worse than all times before it. Religion seems ever expiring, schisms dominant, the light of Truth dim, its adherents scattered. The cause of Christ is ever in its last agony, as though it were but a question of time whether it fails finally this day or another. Let us not be anxious at the troubles which now encompass us. They have ever been; they shall ever be; they are our portion.

Ours is a perplexing time. We are living in a golden age of material prosperity, unprecedented in all of history, but we have become "lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God." We profit from technological progress even as evils increase. Our current century has entered what Churchill called 'the abyss of a new Dark Age, made more sinister by the lights of perverted science." In these times, we hear the voice of Christ: "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

ShareLife Sunday marks the first collection for our parish's annual campaign.


