

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

There in the Upper Room

If I look for the source of my vocation, as Pope John Paul II said, "it is beating there in the Upper Room in Jerusalem." It is there in the Upper Room, during the last supper of Jesus with his disciples, at the first celebration of the Eucharist, that I find my vocation, and that of all priests. Indeed, I was set apart to serve God and his Church even from the time that I was in my mother's womb. Every time I celebrate the Eucharist the words of Jesus resonate in my heart, which he spoke to the Apostles on that night. I am certain that Jesus, on that very night, was thinking also of me and had already placed his hands on my head. — Cardinal Robert Sarah

It is now sixteen years since my ordination on 10 May 2008 at St. Michael's Cathedral by Cardinal Collins. There is nothing special about the number sixteen, but with the recent death of my mother and the changes that have come along with that, I find myself reflecting on that mysterious thing called a 'vocation.'

The Serra Club hosts an annual Ordinandi Dinner to recognize the men about to be ordained that year. Each future priest gives a thumbnail sketch of his 'vocation story.' I began my 'story' with a tribute to a special person who had an important early influence on my life:

They say that faith is caught, not taught. Looking back, it seems to me that my vocation was always there, lying dormant like a seed in dry ground, needing only the water of faith for it to germinate. Many people had a hand in awakening my vocation, but more and more I realize how much I owe to my grade two teacher, Mrs. Noonan. She lives in my memory as a grandmotherly woman, near retirement, who had a deep faith which permeated everything that she did. I am sure that, in Heaven, she is still interceding for me.

It is important to promote religious vocations, but the people who helped me most were not promoting vocations; they were simply passing on the faith.

It would take too long to recount in detail all the graces by which God led me to the priesthood. However, like Pope John Paul II and Cardinal Sarah, I find the real source of my vocation "beating there in the Upper Room." As the Lord said to the prophet Jeremiah, "Before J formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations."

The word 'vocation' comes from the Hain vocare, to call. When Jesus called his disciples he simply said "Follow me." Jesus continues to invite men and women to religious life. However, they are free either to decline that invitation or to respond in faith as the disciples did: "And they left everything and followed him."


