FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Paradigm Shifts

Now all these heretics are of much later date than the bishops to whom the apostles committed the Churches. It follows, as a matter of course, that these heretics, since they are blind to the truth and deviate from the right way, will walk in various roads; and therefore the footsteps of their doctrine are scattered here and there without agreement or connection. But the path belonging to the Church circumscribes the whole world, as possessing the sure tradition from the Apostles, and gives witness that the faith of all is one and the same, since all receive one and the same God the Father — St. Irenaeus, *Against Heresies* (c. 185 A.D.)

The concept of a 'paradigm shift' was introduced by Thomas Kuhn in *The Structure of Scientific Revolutions*, published in 1962. A paradigm is a pattern or model that gives a mental picture of the way the world works. Scientific progress is usually gradual and incremental, but there are also huge leaps forward when the current scientific consensus is challenged and a radical new theory is proposed and, after considerable controversy, finally accepted.

An example of a paradigm shift is the 'Copernican Revolution.' In the ancient world it was assumed that the earth was the fixed center of the universe with the sun and stars circling around it. In the 16th century that assumption was challenged by Nicolaus Copernicus in his work, *On the Revolutions of the Celestial Spheres*. He presented a new model of the solar system which we now take for granted.

There are many in the Church today who see the Second Vatican Council (1962-65) as a paradigm shift. The late Andrew Greeley (priest/novelist/sociologist) wrote:

There are two major interpretations of the Second Vatican Council. The first is that the Council was an 'occurrence,' a meeting of the bishops of the world, who enacted certain reforms and clarified certain doctrines. It was therefore an exercise in continuity and not in change; it did not drastically change the nature of the Church. The second interpretation is that the Council was a momentous 'event,' indeed one of the most dramatic and important events in the history of Catholicism, a structure-shattering event one could almost call a revolution.

This second interpretation was categorically rejected by Pope Benedict XVI who contrasted the 'hermeneutic of rupture' (bad) with the 'hermeneutic of continuity' (good). The Catholic Church does recognize paradigm shifts in religion, such as those proposed by Arius, Pelagius, etc. they are called heresies. The paradigm shift in St. Irenaeus' day was Gnosticism. The great work by St. Irenaeus might just as well be titled *Against Paradigm Shifts*.


