#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Say the black and do the red.

The liturgical books, approved by the competent authority, are to be faithfully followed in the celebration of the sacraments. Accordingly, no one may on a personal initiative add to or omit or alter anything in those books. — Canon Law 846 §1.

I have not always been a priest. Up to the age of fortytwo the idea of being a priest never entered my mind.

As a lay person I formed certain definite opinions regarding the way Mass ought to be celebrated. Particularly, the priest should not be the center of attention. Whatever my personal feelings for 'Fr. Bob', I went to Mass to encounter Jesus, not him. The priest wears a fancy chasuble instead of street clothes in order to show that he is acting *in persona Christi*, that is, 'in the person of Christ'. Like an actor, his own personality disappears as he takes on the person of Christ, offering the sacrifice of the Mass.

For this reason, the priest has no right to impose his own personality on the Mass. Like an actor speaking his lines, the words and actions of the priest are given in the *Roman Missal* (the book on the Altar). Usually the words to be spoken are written in black, and the actions to be performed are written in red ('rubrics' from Latin for red, *rubeo*).

That said, however, the Roman Missal requires the priest celebrant to select from among many permissible options in the Mass. For example, the first words spoken after the sign of the cross can be: a) "The Lord be with you"; or b) "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the Communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all"; or c) "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ". Any of these three greetings is acceptable. "Good morning, everybody!" is not an option.

Next follows the Penitential Act. There are again three options: a) "I confess ..."; b) "Have mercy on us Lord ..."; c) "You were sent to heal the contrite of heart ...". I often hear option 'c', but I have only ever heard option 'b' twice in my life, and both times the congregation was perplexed.

The *Kyrie* comes next, but only if "I confess" is used. It can be either in the original Greek (*Kyrie eleison, Christe eleison*) or English (but not Latin!). For the other Mass parts (*Gloria,* Creed, *Sanctus, Agnus Dei,* Our Father) either Latin or English is equally acceptable. Any musical setting is permitted, although the Gregorian chant settings are given in another liturgical book, the *Graduale*. There are thirteen Eucharistic prayers, including three which are dumbed down for children. For reason that I may explain later, my preference is for the *Roman Canon* (Eucharistic Prayer I).

Except for the hymns chosen by our music ministry, the Mass is celebrated 'by the book', as it should be. As a pewsitter I was not looking for any creativity from the celebrant. All I wanted was for him to say the black, and do the red.
