#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

#### Old and Fine Books

The acquisition of Christian books is necessary for those who can use them. For the mere sight of these books renders us less inclined to sin, and incites us to believe more firmly in righteousness. — Bishop Epiphanius (4th c.)

Books have always been played an important part in my life. As a high-school student in Montreal I made frequent bus trips downtown to the multi-story Classic Book Shop. There I found the Penguin Classics series which published, among things, 'The Confessions' of St. Augustine and the autobiography of St. Teresa of Avila. Although I was read these books as literature, they also awakened an interest to learn more about the Catholic faith.

Later, having graduated from University and working in St. Catharines, my regular port-of-call was a second-hand bookstore just off Montebello Park. Here one didn't so much browse as excavate. The books were two-deep on the shelves with more spilling out of cardboard boxes on the floor. The section on Christianity was a kind of gold-mine, with nuggets of gold to be found amidst the clutter.

'Old and Fine Books' in St. Catharines was owned and run by a wonderful woman, Hannelore Headley. I vaguely knew that, as a child, she had lived in Shanghai during the Japanese occupation of China in the Second World War. Only recently did I learn the full story, which she recounts in a book about her early life, 'Blond China Doll.'

Hannelore Heinemann was born into a Jewish family in Berlin in 1936. Her father was the successful proprietor of a bookstore. Although life for Jews was becoming increasingly difficult under Nazi rule, it was inconceivable that there could be any real danger in a modern civilized society. The events of Kristallnacht, the 'night of broken glass,' in 1938 shattered that belief. The Heinemann family had been desperately trying to leave Germany for safety, but no country would issue them a visa. Finally, they were able to secure passage to Shanghai. That is how little Hannelore came to grow up in China.

The family survived the Japanese occupation during the war but life again became precarious when the Communists came to power. In 1951 they were in the midst of fleeing China when her father was arrested for 'anti-Communist activity'. He remained imprisoned for more than a year before finally being put on trial and being sentenced to deportation! The family came to Canada, where Ms Headley eventually opened her marvelous bookstore in St. Catharine, following the family tradition.

I have fond memories of the many hours I spent browsing in her store, and tremendous gratitude. Thank God for good books. And thank God for those whose vocation is to make those books available to us.
