FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine.

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name *Purgatory* to this final purification of the elect. — Catechism of the Catholic Church

Traditionally a Catholic funeral Mass is known as a 'Requiem' from the first word of the Introit (Entrance Antiphon): *Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis* — 'Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.' Some years ago I added this prayer to the Prayers of the Faithful at Mass for the holy souls in Purgatory.

One of the most profound reflections on Purgatory was dictated by St. Catherine of Genoa (1447-1510) —

There is no joy except that in Heaven which compares to the joy of souls in Purgatory. This joy increases day by day because of the way that the love of God corresponds to that of the soul. The impediment to that love is the rust of sin. The more the rust of sin is consumed by fire, the more the soul responds to that love, and its joy increases. The soul is like gold that becomes purer as it is fired. Having come to the point of twenty-four carats, gold cannot be purified any further; and this is what happens to the soul in the fire of God's love.

St. Catherine understood that there is no gate between Purgatory and Heaven. But Heaven is so pure that the soul prefers to suffer the cleansing pains of Purgatory rather than enter among the saints with any stain of sin remaining.

As for Heaven, whoever wishes to enter does so. Allmerciful God stands there with his arms wide open, waiting to receive us into his glory. I also see, however, that the divine essence is so pure and light-filled that the soul that has but the slightest imperfection would rather throw itself into a thousand hells than appear thus before the divine presence. Tongue cannot express nor heart understand the full meaning of Purgatory, which the soul willingly accepts as a mercy. The greatest suffering of the souls in Purgatory is their awareness that there is still something within them that displeases God. These souls fully grasp the meaning of what blocks them on their way to God. As it is being drawn upwards, the soul feels itself melting in the fire of that love of God, for he will not cease until he has brought the soul to perfection.

The Christian doctrine of Purgatory is truly consoling. Despite our present faults, in the end we will all enter into the joy of God's presence as Saints.


