

#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

A Blue Christmas

I guess you were right, Linus. I guess I really don't know what Christmas is all about. Isn't there *anyone* who knows what Christmas is all about? — Charlie Brown

As I have gotten older Christmas is less about 'Jingle Bells' and 'Jolly Old St. Nick' and more about the silence of the stable in Bethlehem. The excitement of Christmas is for children. Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus! For adults, Christmas is about being with family. For those separated from family it can be a sad time.

Before coming to Our Lady of Fatima I lived with my mother in Ottawa from November 2021 until the end of June 2022. Looking back on that time I see it as a great blessing. For the first time since my ordination I was able to be with her for Christmas and Easter. After arriving here I would go back to see her for a couple of days every three or four weeks. In September of last year we had to move her into a nursing home. I was not able to see her last Christmas but I took some vacation time after New Year's and dropped in to see her every day from January 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup>, which was my birthday. My sister called the following Sunday, January 7<sup>th</sup> to say that Mom had passed away.

When I was living with my Mom we did a lot of baking. There were few days that we did not have some kind of pie or cake for dessert. A couple of weeks ago I took advantage of a school PA Day to make my Mom's famous apple square. The familiar work of peeling the apples and rolling out the dough evoked a sad feeling of nostalgia. But then I got out the good Wedgewood plates and teacups and I treated the 'Friday ladies' to a tea party in the Sacristy.

For so many people the Christmas season brings with it feelings of grief and loneliness, especially when the death of a loved one has occurred around this time of year. As a society we do not handle grief well. We are expected to just get on with our lives. And as Christians may feel that we are expected to 'rejoice' that our loved ones are now with God.

But as St. Augustine said:

There are some who say that we should not grieve, but let them try if they can. It is impossible for us not to taste as bitter the death of those whose life for us was such a source of sweetness. Their death afflicts our heart even as our faith gives us the surer consolation that they are now freed from the evils of this present life.

It will be a 'blue' Christmas for me this year. And I am totally okay with that. As C.S. Lewis wrote in *A Grief Observed*, "The pain I feel now is the happiness I had before. That's the deal." I will do some Christmas baking, just as I did last year. Christmas would not be Christmas without the traditional raisin bread made according to the recipe passed down to me by my Babcia (Polish Grandma).
