#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

#### Mimetic desire

Man is the creature who does not know what to desire, and he turns to others in order to make up his mind. We desire what others desire because we imitate their desires. — Réné Girard

In the Book of Exodus we read, "Do not follow the crowd in doing wrong." This instruction, like much in the Bible, is easy to understand but not easy to implement. We humans are social animals. We naturally move in herds. When the herd is moving in the wrong direction, it is hard being the non-conformist who bucks the tide.

The French intellectual Réné Girard developed a theory of what he called 'mimetic desire.' Mimetic means imitative, from the same root as 'mime'. When we see others in our group desiring a certain thing, we develop a desire for the same thing as well. The impulse is subconscious but powerful.

Simply put, we tend to want what other people want. That is why we have fads. For example, there is usually one 'must-have' Christmas gift that sells out early in the stores. Currently, many otherwise rational people have an irresistible urge to get tattoos. It is part of our built-in nature as social beings to hop on the bandwagon. This tendency is in itself neither good nor bad — but it does make a huge difference whether the bandwagon is heading for the 'Celestial City' or the 'City of Destruction.'

We humans are intellectual animals: we are a combination of intellectual nature and animal nature. Like the lower animals we are moved by instinct and appetite. As intellectual beings, however, we can examine our motivations and if necessary, control our urges or channel them in positive directions.

Like all our other faculties, the intellect can be misused. All too often we engage in rationalization, quieting the nagging voice of conscience and finding 'good' reasons for doing what our better angels tell us is wrong.

Socrates famously said that "the unexamined life is not worth living." He meant that we should not simply drift through life pandering to our baser instincts; rather, we ought to live intentionally, with purpose, cultivating those virtuous habits which lead to human fulfillment. The life of virtue is challenging but ultimately rewarding.

This may seem to be an odd meditation for Advent, but when so many are mindlessly following the pied piper of secularism in this 'holiday season,' I want to be intentional. Like everyone else, I too have a natural tendency to move with the herd. My 'herd' consists of St. Irenaeus and Augustine and Teresa of Avila and all the other great saints. I find myself desiring what they desired. But like St. Paul: "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own."
