

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Tidings of great joy

For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. — Nicene Creed

Some years ago, when the English version of the Roman Missal was updated, the words of the Nicene Creed were changed. In the phrase "was born of the Virgin Mary and became man" the word 'born' was replaced by 'incarnate.' This is a direct translation of the Latin 'incarnatus', which derives from *caro/carnis*, "flesh." As St. John writes in the prolog of his Gospel: "And the Word became *flesh* and dwelt among us." *Et Verbum* caro *factum est*.

This apparently minor change has important theological implications. We celebrate Christmas as the coming of the Messiah, but on that winter night in Bethlehem the Messiah had already been in the world for nine months. When the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she had been chosen to be the mother of the Messiah, and when Mary spoke her *fiat* — 'let it be done to me according to your word' — at that moment the second person of the Trinity took on the fullness of our human nature, both body and soul. The Feast of the Annunciation, celebrated on March 25th, is also the Feast of the Incarnation.

When Mary visited Elizabeth, then in her sixth month of pregnancy, Elizabeth's child 'leapt in her womb' for joy at the presence of the Messiah, and Elizabeth addressed Mary as "the mother of my Lord." At this time Mary was not yet 'showing', yet the "true light that enlightens every man" had come into the world.

There is an ancient tradition that the Incarnation and the Crucifixion occurred on the same date. Indeed, a few years ago Good Friday coincided with the Feast of the Annunciation. The celebration of the Incarnation therefore is overshadowed by the observances of Holy Week and Easter. It is perfectly understandable, therefore, that the birth of Jesus should take on greater prominence, especially as it occurs at a significant time of the year so close to the winter solstice.

For nine months the Messiah lay hidden from the world in the womb of his virgin mother. He was like a Christmas present still in its gift wrap. In the stable in Bethlehem the present was finally unwrapped. On Christmas night the coming of God as man is made manifest and proclaimed.

And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good tiding of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord."


