The Holy Family

Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was obedient to them, and his mother treasured all these things in her heart. — Luke 2:51

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ (Philippians 1:2), and a blessed Christmas season! This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. On this day the Church calls us to reflect on the relationship of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. This feast day highlights the importance of family: God sanctified the family by choosing to have an earthly mother and (foster) father. As Pope Benedict XVI said in an Angelus reflection: "In the Gospel, we do not find discourses on the family but an event which is worth more than any words: God wanted to be born and to grow up in a human family. In this way, he consecrated the family as the first and ordinary means of his encounter with humanity".

The Gospel today gives insight into each family member's primary role: to accompany one another in discovering and journeying on the path the Father has destined for us.

At the age of twelve, Jesus was left behind in the Temple, and it took His parents three days to find him. Any parent will know how terrible the feeling is of not knowing whether your child is safe; how distraught Mary and Joseph must have been! When they finally find Jesus in the Temple, Mary expresses her anxiety, to which Jesus replies, "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" At first sight, this response may be seen as lacking in sensitivity, but Pope Benedict notes it showed Mary and Joseph that their child was called to a greater mission, beyond their understanding.

Each member of the Holy Family leads and accompanies the others to do God's Will through their example. Mary obeyed Gabriel's Message, and Joseph obeyed the angel he encountered in his dreams. Jesus recognized that the Father's will must be done and that he must be obedient to his parents: "Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was obedient to them." Though perplexed by her son, Mary shows a contemplative recognition of her child's greater calling and destiny: "His mother treasured all these things in her heart."

Let us conclude with Pope Benedict's invocation of the Holy Family: "Let us now invoke for every family, especially families in difficulty, the protection of Mary Most Holy and of St. Joseph. May they sustain such families so that they can resist the disintegrating forces of a certain contemporary culture which undermines the very foundations of the family institution. May they help Christian families be living images of God's love in every part of the world."

NEW YEAR'S DAY – Mary, Mother of God *Wednesday, January 01, 2025*



Time and again the Old Testament considers the birth of a child, especially a first-born son, to be God's greatest blessing. But a more pessimistic strain occurs also, for to be human is to know uncertainty, pain and death. None can

avoid this law. In his letter to the Galatians this is Paul's starting point. God's Son, a Jew born of Mary, knew the subjection of human life even to undergoing his people's custom of circumcision. His perfect acceptance of human life has filled it with glorious possibilities. Before we were slaves; now in the name of Jesus and through his Spirit we can call God Father. But what have these readings to do with Mary, mother of God? From the fifth century, January 1, was celebrated in Rome as her feast. The mother of this child must be remembered with him. Mary's assent to God's plan marks the new age of humanity allowing us to pass from slavery to the freedom of God's children. How blessed were we when God chose Mary to be the mother of his Son!
