FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Bible believing and Bible preaching.

The biggest story in the faith space is the rise of the 'Nones' - those who reject religion entirely. The second biggest story is the rise of the 'Nons' - nondenominational Christians. — Ryan Burge, Graphs About Reliaion.

The 'mainline' Protestant denominations have been in steep decline for many decades. At the same time there has been a proliferation of unaffiliated Evangelical churches. What these have in common is a firm conviction that the Bible is the word of God. They pride themselves on being 'Bible-believing and Bible-preaching.'

As Catholics, we can applaud any proclamation of Jesus as 'the way, the truth, and the life.' St. Paul said, "The important thing is that in every way, whether from false motives or true, Christ is preached. And because of this, I rejoice." The problem with the mainline denominations is that they are no longer Bible-believing. The question for the 'Nons' is "What do you mean by Bible-preaching?"

The issue is nicely summarized by St. Francis de Sales in a letter to the Protestants of his day:

If there is need of nothing more than the doctrine of the pure word of God contained in the Bible, then why do you have preachers? If you can feed yourselves in the field of Scripture, what do you want with pastors? Any mere child who is able to read the Bible will do just as well.

The problem with the Protestant doctrine of sola scriptura, 'the Bible alone', is that everyone who reads the Bible will have their own interpretation. The 'father' of the Protestant Reformation, Martin Luther, read the Bible and preached one set of doctrines. Calvin read the Bible and preached something different. Which of them was right?

The Catholic faith is based on the premise that Christian doctrine did not disappear with the last of the Apostles, only to be rediscovered fifteen centuries later by Luther or Calvin. We do not accept that every Christian writer, since the first century, got it wrong. My great saint, St. Irenaeus recounts stories about St. John the Evangelist told to him by St. Polycarp. Did Irenaeus and Polycarp misunderstand the basics of the faith as preached by the Apostles? Of course not! We have a letter written by Polycarp and a book written by Irenaeus "On the Apostolic Preaching." The faith that they professed is the same faith that we profess today.

As Catholics we affirm, just like the "Nons', that the Bible is the word of God. Like them, we pride ourselves on being Bible-believing and Bible-preaching. The difference is that we recognize that the Church, from the beginning, has been both these things. We have, for example, hundreds of St. Augustine's homilies and biblical commentaries. We do not need to re-invent Christianity.
