FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The deposit of faith.

Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture form one sacred deposit of the word of God, committed to the Church... The teaching office [of the Church] is not above the word of God, but serves it, teaching only what has been handed on, listening to it devoutly, guarding it scrupulously and explaining it faithfully in accord with a divine commission. With the help of the Holy Spirit it draws from this one deposit of faith everything which it presents for belief as divinely revealed. — *Dei Verbum*: The Dogmatic Constitution On Divine Revelation, Second Vatican Council.

In a conversation between a Catholic and an Evangelical Protestant, the question was asked, "Why aren't you Catholic?" The Evangelical cited the authority of the Pope as one argument against the legitimacy of the Catholic Church. The example given was Pope Francis' statements on global warming: "The signs of climate change are here and increasingly evident. The world is collapsing and may be nearing the breaking point." Are the Catholic faithful required to believe in global warning *as a matter of faith*?

After the embarrassment of the Galileo episode, Popes have wisely refrained from pontificating on matters of science. Even on matters of theology, where they can claim genuine expertise, Popes have been careful to state when they are writing as a 'private theologian' rather than as the Roman Pontiff. The Pope is not an oracle. He is not some kind of spiritual medium, channeling the Holy Spirit. Over the course of the last two thousand years there have been good Popes and bad Popes; some were saints and others were scoundrels.

We respect the office of the Pope as the visible sign of unity in the Church, and we value his important role in defending the faith from what Pope John Paul II called 'alternative proposals.' The Pope, however, has legitimate authority to teach "only what has been handed on." This is clearly stated by the *First* Vatican Council in its definition of papal infallibility:

For the Holy Spirit was not promised to the successors of Peter that by His revelation they might make known new doctrine, but that by His assistance they might inviolably keep and faithfully expound the revelation or deposit of faith delivered through the Apostles.

Many people, not only Protestants but some Catholics as well, mistakenly believe that the Church, led by the Pope, can make changes to Christian doctrine. It simply cannot be done. It cannot be done by any theologian or any group of theologians; it cannot be done by any Bishop or any Synod of Bishops; it cannot be done by any Ecumenical Council; it cannot be done by any Pope. It cannot be done by anyone. It cannot be done at all. ጲ

The Lift Jesus Higher Rally 2025


