FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Getting ready for Lent

On this Lenten journey let us be careful to accept Christ's invitation to follow him more decisively and consistently, renewing the grace and commitments of our Baptism, to cast off the former person within us and put on Christ, in order to arrive at Easter renewed and able to say, with St. Paul: "It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me." — Pope Benedict XVI.

The date of Easter varies each year because it is linked to the Jewish Passover which occurs on the first full moon after the spring equinox. This means that Easter can occur on any date between March 22nd and April 25th. This year it falls on April 20th. Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, therefore arrives on March 5th.

In Dante's *Divine Comedy*, the Latin poet Virgil comes to guide Dante to heaven. But the path leads them first down through the seven circles of hell. Only when they have reached the very bottom of the lowest pit are they able to climb the seven-story mountain of purgatory and, from there, ascend into the heavenly realms.

Dante's fictional journey illustrates a spiritual truth: there can be no Resurrection without Calvary. The people of Israel wandered in the desert for forty years before entering the Promised Land. We need the forty days of our Lenten 'desert', culminating in the observance of Good Friday, to fully experience the joy of the Easter.

Lent is a grace-filled time to free ourselves the many distractions in life. During this time we strive to practice a more disciplined life, putting a curb on our appetites in order to live more 'intentionally.'


I had a former boss who said, "Whenever I feel the urge to exercise, I lie down until it passes." How well that describes our response to the promptings of the Holy Spirit! When we are awakened to our need for a closer union with God, we hit the snooze button on our spiritual alarm clock.

The great Cardinal Zen, former Archbishop of Hong Kong, put it this way:

Lent is a time for awakening. When we are asleep, we are detached from reality. When we are awake, we are conscious of reality. To be renewed and reformed is to be brought back to the original, fundamental, beautiful reality. And what is that reality? It is that God loves me; God loves us. We are blessed to share a glorious eternal life with Christ. That requires us to participate in His suffering and death. Through the austerity and abstinence of Lent, we put to death the sinner in our hearts. Let us, therefore, hasten our pace and strain forward.

As St. Paul said: "Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own."
