FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The sadness of Christ.

Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray." And taking with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me." And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will." — Matthew 26:36-39.

During this season of Lent the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary come to the fore. As we meditate on the first of these mysteries, the agony of Jesus in the garden, we might wonder, as St. Thomas More once did, why Jesus experienced such extreme mental anguish:

Christ is the very prototype and leader of martyrs. He told his disciples not to be afraid of those who kill the body. How is it fitting, then, that he should be terrified at the approach of pain and be so utterly downcast?

St. Thomas More pondered this question while he was a prisoner in the Tower of London awaiting execution for his resistance to the iniquities of King Henry VIII. He shared his reflections in a book which he titled *The Sadness, the Weariness, and the Prayer of Christ Before He Was Taken Prisoner*. For More, this was not an academic exercise but a profound meditation on the passion of Christ in light of his own impending death.

More understands that Christ was not simply overcome by fear and sadness, but that he freely *chose* to suffer this great mental distress:

I say "chose" and not "was forced" because who could have forced God? Jesus *chose* to moderate the influence of his divinity on his humanity for such a time and in such a way that he was able to yield to the passions of our frail humanity and to suffer them with such terrible intensity. Because he came into the world to earn joy for us by his own sorrow, and since that future joy of ours was to be fulfilled in our souls as well as our bodies, he chose to experience not only the pain of torture in his body, but also the most bitter feelings of sadness, fear and weariness in his mind.

When Jesus left the upper room of the Last Supper and went with his disciples to the Mount of Olives, he knew exactly what was going to happen next. Jesus knew that his agonizing death on the cross would lead to his glorious resurrection. It was to accomplish this that he came into the world. And as the Letter to the Hebrews says, he was like us in all things but sin. Jesus was determined to test the limits of human suffering — not only physical suffering, but mental suffering as well.
