FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Solemnity of the Annunciation

The Angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus... The Angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God... Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." — Luke 1:26-38

Of all ancient cultures, the people of Israel are unique in their belief that there is only one God. The great prayer of the Hebrew people is the *Shema*: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one." Isaiah proclaims: "I am the Lord, and there is no other. Besides me there is no God." How, then, did the disciples come to believe that Jesus was more than a great prophet, and that he was actually *God*? For a faithful Jew this would have been an impossible idea.

At Caesarea Philippi, Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" It is Peter who replied, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." When Jesus was about to raise Lazarus, Martha says to him, "Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world." Nowhere in the Prophets, however, is the Messiah described as a divine person.

When we read the Gospels we see that Jesus gradually prepared his disciples for the truth of his identity. The proof, however, came only after the Resurrection when, as St. Paul tells us, "he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive." It is on account of this eye-witness testimony that St. Paul can attest that "there is one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist."

On the Solemnity of the Annunciation we celebrate the single most important event in the whole of human history. When Mary spoke her *fiat* to the Archangel Gabriel, God became man in her virginal womb.

As Pope St. Leo the Great preached in one of his homilies on the Incarnation:

When the Son of God assumed our human nature he enlarged our humanity without diminishing his divinity. Each nature exercises its own activity in communion with the other. The Word does what is proper to the Word and the flesh fulfills what is proper to the flesh. One and the same *person* — this must be said over and over again — is truly the Son of God and truly the Son of Man. He is God in virtue of the fact that 'in the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.' He is man in virtue of the fact that 'the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.'
