#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

#### The song of Bernadette.

We all know and love Bernadette Soubirous. This simple girl from the Pyrenees, with no access to education, retained a pure and honest heart that was able to see the Mother of the Lord. Mary pointed her to the spring of water which has become a sign that shows where the source of life is found. This water is an image of truth that comes to us in faith. Bernadette is a sign of how we ought to live. We must not lose our simple hearts. We must always pray for the humility that enables the heart to see the beauty and goodness of God, and to find the spring from which flows the purifying life-giving water. — Pope Benedict XVI, Homily on his 85<sup>th</sup> birthday, 16 April 2012.

We recently celebrated the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes, and it brought to mind one of my all-time favorite saints, Bernadette. The 1943 film, *The Song of Bernadette*, is based on a novel of the same name by the Austrian novelist Franz Werfel. Because of his Jewish faith, he and his family were forced to flee Nazi-ruled Austria in 1938. They found shelter in the town of Lourdes before being able to make their way to America. In thanksgiving for their escape, he wrote the story of Bernadette.

Thinking about Bernadette, I was surprised that I could not find her feast day in the Missal! Her feast day used to be on February 18<sup>th</sup>, a date associated with the apparitions, but it was subsequently moved to April 16<sup>th</sup>, the date of her death in 1879, at the age of 35. This year her feast day falls within Holy Week, so it cannot be celebrated. Nevertheless, her (accidental?) absence from the Missal is perplexing and annoying. As Pope Benedict said, this is a saint who is *known and loved by all*!

Bernadette, like the children of Fatima, had a beautiful simplicity. Like Lucia, she entered a convent and lived an outwardly unexceptional life. She was asked, "When you encounter people, even priests, who refuse to believe what you are telling them, don't you feel any anger or resentment?" She answered, "No. I tell them what I have seen and heard, and then if they don't want to believe me, they are free not to. It is none of my business."

The Canadian Jewish poet and songwriter, Leonard Cohen, also wrote a *Song of Bernadette*:

There was a child named Bernadette / I heard the story long ago / She saw the Queen of Heaven once / and kept the vision in her soul / No one believed what she had seen / No one believed what she heard / That there were sorrows to be healed /and mercy, mercy in this world / So many hearts I find / broke like yours and mine / torn by what we've done and can't undo / I just want to hold you / come on, let me hold you / like Bernadette would do.
