FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Our program for the Third Millennium

All the Christian faithful, of whatever state or rank, are called to the fullness of the Christian life. It would be a contradiction to settle for a life of mediocrity, marked by a minimalist ethic and a shallow religiosity. The time has come to re-propose wholeheartedly to everyone this high standard of ordinary Christian living. — Pope John Paul II, *Novo Millennio Ineunte*.

Until the start of the conclave I had never heard the name Robert Prevost. The commentators dismissed any suggestion that he was *papabile*, noting that an *American* Pope was unthinkable. The College of Cardinals, however, clearly saw in him the necessary qualities to guide the Church in the coming decades. As a 'young' Pope — he is 69 years old — we can expect a long pontificate.

In the coming days and weeks we will be paying close attention to Pope Leo's homilies and speeches as he lays out the principal goals of his pontificate. Whom he appoints to the key offices in the Vatican will indicate the direction he wishes to take the Church. He also has important decisions to make regarding some critical issues: the secret concordat with Communist China, Vatican financial corruption, and the Synod on Synodality.

My hope is that Pope Leo will take as his point of reference the encyclical that Pope John Paul II issued at the start of the new millennium, *Novo Millennio Ineunte*. In this encyclical Pope John Paul set out a roadmap for the Church for the coming century. That was twenty-five years ago! Yet here we are, a quarter of the way into the century, and rather than making progress along the path laid out for us, the Church has been engaged in the self-referential exercise of synodality. Ironically, the synodal process is scheduled to culminate with a grand 'Ecclesial Assembly' in 2028, the *fiftieth* anniversary of the start of the pontificate of Pope John Paul II.

In my first homily in this parish I referred to *Novo Millennio Ineunte* as our 'mission statement.' I am unapologetically a 'JP2 priest.' JP2's great encyclicals — *The Splendor of Truth, Faith and Reason, The Gospel of Life* — and the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* were milestones on my spiritual journey to the priesthood. My hope is that Pope Leo also sees himself as a JP2 priest and will follow the path set out by that great Pope. We do not need to invent a new program. As Pope John Paul wrote:

The program already exists: it is the plan found in the Gospel and in the living Tradition, it is the same as ever. It has its center in Christ himself, who is to be known, loved and imitated. This is a program which does not change with shifts of times and cultures. This program for all times is our program for the Third Millennium.
