FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

On the Apostolic Preaching.

I myself saw Polycarp in my early years, for he lived a long time and was very old indeed when he laid down his life by a glorious and most splendid martyrdom. At all times he taught the things which he had learned from the Apostles, which the Church transmits, which alone are true. These facts are attested by all the churches of Asia and by the successors of Polycarp to this day — and he was a much more trustworthy and dependable witness to the truth than Valentinus and Marcion and all the other wrong-headed persons. In the time of Anicetus he stayed for a while in Rome, where he won over many from the camp of these heretics to the Church of God, proclaiming that the one and only truth he had received from the Apostles was the truth transmitted by the Church. — St. Irenaeus

I celebrated my first Mass here at Fatima three years ago on June 28th, 2022, the feast day of St. Irenaeus, one of my all-time favorite Saints. Irenaeus is cited thirty times in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, and fourteen excerpts from his writings are included in the *Divine Office*, which are required reading for every Catholic priest every year. He has the rare distinction of being a 'Doctor of the Church.'

Pope Benedict XVI, in his teaching on the Apostolic Fathers, gave this thumbnail biography:

Irenaeus was born in Smyrna around 135-140 A.D. In his youth he attended the school of Bishop Polycarp, a disciple in his turn of the Apostle John. In 177 A.D. he was listed as a priest in Lyons. He later became Bishop of the city. He devoted himself without reserve to his ministry which ended with his martyrdom in 202 A.D.

St. Irenaeus wrote many works but only two survive: *Against Heresies* and *On the Apostolic Preaching*. What I found surprising when I first started reading Irenaeus was how unsurprising he actually is. What he teaches is simply the Catholic faith that is familiar to all of us. This was the teaching of St. John as handed on by St. Polycarp.

Keep in mind that St. John was entrusted by Jesus with the care of his mother and John 'took her as his own.' They later lived in Ephesus, which is also closely associated with St. Paul, St. Luke, and St. Timothy, bishop of that city. This is the main source of Irenaeus' teaching. He is a key witness to the faith of the Church in the time of the Apostles.

I have a vivid recollection of Bishop Polycarp and how he would speak of his familiar conversations with John and with the rest of those who had seen the Lord. Whatever things he had heard from the eye-witnesses of the Word of life, he would recount in harmony with the Scriptures. I listened attentively to these things and treasured them in my heart, and I am continually turning these things over accurately in my mind.
